
Our September Young Eagles Rally was another for the chapter record book, if we kept one (guess this newsletter is the closest to a record book we have). So far this year we have shattered

our single event record in February, April, May, June, and September. In June we actually exceeded our previous annual record set in 2010.

Also in September, Debbie Morris and Thomas Moore joined the elite group of Young Eagle Flight Leaders in achieving "10 for 12," which happens to be yet another record. We now have 11 members that have achieved "10 for 12," so all of their flights accrue credits for our chapter's annual scholarship program.

Michelle Kunes, EAA National Young Eagles Program Administrator, prepared a report from the EAA database of our chapter history from the past 20 years (see chart below). Members of our chapter have introduced 2397 Young Eagles to the thrill of flight since the program began in 1992.

It has been an exciting year for our chapter's Young Eagle Program. We could not have achieved what we have so far without the continuing support of Flightways Columbus, Waffle House, Skyline Columbus and all our volunteers. Thank you to all the pilots, aircraft owners, ground volunteers and Flightways staff that make it happen each month.

Get-there-itis

Our newest grandchild – third grandson, fifth overall – arrived in Tifton more than a week early, and I was assigned the privilege of entertaining his eight-year-old brother while mom and dad recovered and adjusted to the newest addition. Chris Cook volunteered to fly me down, and we planned a crack-o-dawn takeoff so I could get there before the

elder of the two grandsons would be able to work up enough momentum to become a distraction.

I didn't expect the fog.

We delayed 90 minutes based on forecast clearing in Tifton; but when I arrived at Chris' hangar, it was still 600' overcast in mist with ³/₄ mile visibility. Fortunately, "Rocket" Rick Payne showed up and distracted me with a tour of the Carmike Learjet. But after an hour, I had a bad case of "getthere-itis."

I tried to fight it. I tried to hide it. But I was a mess. Even though I've read hundreds, and maybe thousands, of stories about pilots whose lives ended badly because they succumbed to the pressure to be somewhere instead of waiting for the weather to clear, I was itching to get there. I had a grandson, no, TWO grandsons, who needed me and I was diddling around in a multi-million-dollar jet instead of rushing down to help them.

At that moment, I realized the power of "get-there-itis" to treat sound reasoning like South Carolina treated Georgia, and I became very glad I was not the PIC. I could have

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made a disastrous decision.

The trip down was a delight – easy IFR with Chris and Rocket up front – but I would have struggled to make it VFR with ceilings at 1,500 or so. I will always be grateful to Chris and Rocket for accommodating me and not giving in to an antsy passenger.

As a chapter, we are on the verge of something historic – our 500th Young Eagle. Achieving that would more than double the number of Young Eagle flights we provided last year and would set a milestone for us and the region. We now have 457 official Young Eagle flights and, at our current pace, we could very well break the 500 barrier in October or November, weather permitting. As noble as that goal is, we must avoid "get-there-itis." In addition to being recognized nationally for our productive Young Eagles program, EAA 677 has never had an accident during a Young Eagles flight. That is a record even more important than presenting some youngster our 500th Young Eagle certificate.

Let's stay focused on safety, and let the other records come when they may. We'll all be proud of that.

Thunder in the Valley Update

Sponsorship committee — had their kick-off meeting October 4. The committee created a list of 80 new leads. Committee chair, Don Sharitt, asked the committee to confirm 2012 sponsors for the 2013 show by November 1.

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


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
