# Thunder in the Valley Update

#### **Sponsorships**

The committee got off to a good start with a kick -off meeting October 24. A couple of important revisions were made to the presentation: 1) Thunder in the Valley Air Show's non-profit status and tax identification number was added throughout the presentation. Private donors will need the information and it legitimizes the

organization and 2) a statement was added for the "total contributions" made back to the community through the years — "More than \$700,000 has been given back to the community".

#### **Non-Food Vendors**

An effort is being made to recruit aviation schools this year. Booth space fees will be waived if the school brings a static display. Several schools have responded favorably.

Committee members traveled to the Great Georgia Air Show and Wings Over North Georgia Air Show to research the set-up and management of chalets.

# **Transportation and Parking**

Columbus State University has confirmed same level of support and Muscogee County School District has placed the event on their calendar for the use of their school buses. A meeting request is pending with Walmart and the owner of the property for Titlemax.

#### **Facilities Management**

Committee members met with City Managers and department heads October 21. The City will maintain same level of support as in previous years.

#### **Marketing**

The committee and media partners got off to a good start with a kick-off October 22. The group revisited the campaigns from the 2013



event. Goals set for 2014 were: 1) create more awareness for entertainment inside the gate, 2) family-friendly, 3) more ticket sales increase support for the community and 4) less attention on "titled" acts or statics.

#### **Contracts**

Progress has been made on the contract between the Airport and Thunder in the Valley Air Show.

MWR has submitted a consignment contract for ticket sales at Ft. Benning.

#### **Ticketing**

2014 tickets are in the work flow with Communicorp. A permission statement for photos will be added to the back of the tickets. The permission statement gives Thunder in the Valley Air Show the right to use photos taken during the air show for advertising and promotional use.

McDonalds has donated tray liners to promote ticket sales through their restaurants. The project is in work flow with Bassett and Becker.

# Taking into account....

Donation of tickets to area schools or other youth programs is being considered. Thunder in the Valley Air Show donated tickets several years ago and the return on the investment was not enough to note. Other events and air shows have since implemented the strategy and it has proven positive results for them.

A "Career Day" with local recruiters during setup on Friday, March 14. Logistics for set-up and execution of the event are being reviewed.

An EAA hosted fly-in during the air show. Research is being done with other chapters and air shows that host fly-ins.
