

It's time for all who may have forgotten to pay your 2021 dues. The dues are still only \$20.



I had a conversation with the Chapter's most recent new member, Dave Larson, and I asked him for a bit of info about him and here's what Dave had to say;

"About me, I joined the EAA and chapter 68 this past January, but have been around airplanes most of my life (I'm 46). I've worked on aircraft in the Pa Army Guard as a helicopter mechanic (67V and Y) throughout college. I've also hung around the airport (BVI) helping out Jack Roethlesberger and volunteering at Air Heritage. Lately I've been working on my 1955 Piper Tri-Pacer under the supervision of an A&P. I've always wanted to build my own airplane and have liked the idea of doing some STOL flying. I found the Zenith a good compromise of performance, affordability, and a forgiving design for the first time builder. Zenith offers a monthly rudder building workshop at their factory in Mexico, Missouri. I mentioned it to my wife that they were having a workshop in January and to my surprise said that I should do it and that she would go with me. So that's what we did. We split the 11 hour drive up into two days and had a great time attending the two day workshop. I can't say enough about the Zenith employees. They were very friendly and helpful throughout the workshop. The president of Zenith personally helped with our project and joined us for a Zenith sponsored dinner to relax and talk airplanes. We left the factory with a completed rudder and several kits for a CH-750 STOL. Since we've returned home, I've completed the horizontal stabilizer and have started the elevator. My plan is to take my time and enjoy the process. I have a rough goal of flying this airplane in about 3 years."

Directions to Roy Early's house at 4545 Dutch Ridge Road, Beaver Pa. 15009


Take the Brighton Exit off I376 and go toward the State Police barracks, then turn left on Dutch Ridge Road.
