The February 9, 1996 meeting of EAA Chapter 690 was called to order by President Duane Huff at 8:10 PM followed by the introductions of 35 members and 9 guests in attendance.

He spoke in behalf of the college, which included introducing the A&P program, day and evening class schedules, fee waiver for senior citizens, and Hope scholarship programs. In the event the rally is rained out, the date will be postponed one week which will be April 6, 1996. Requests for pilots and load masters were made at that time.

Greg Jannakos gave the date and time (February 10 th @ 10:00 AM) of his project visit at his home, a continental 75 will be assembled with the help of an A&P.

Frank Wilcox, building committee chairman, gave the building committee report detailing the state of electrical, plumbing, fire and final CEO inspections for the EAA . EAA 690 will put on several pancake breakfasts and is looking for volunteers help with the breakfast and to crew with the ballooning.
