Amelia Earhart Disappearance Reviewed

Chapter Vice President Lee Olson has announced that the program for our Friday, March 14th Chapter 690 meeting will be presented by Thomas F. (Tom) King, Ph.D. Dr. King has researched the disappearance of Amelia Earhart's ill-fated transpacific flight of July 2, 1937 through his association with The International Group for Historic Aircraft Recovery (TIGHAR).



Dr. King has worked in archaeology for some forty years. He holds a Ph.D. from the University of California, Riverside, and did substantial research in California prehistory in the 1960s and 70s. In the late 1970s he was responsible for establishing the Micronesian Archaeological Survey, which has sponsored research in the western Pacific islands of Micronesia, and helped develop historic preservation

programs in the area's island nations.

Early in his career he became concerned about the destruction of archaeological sites, American Indian and Micronesian spiritual places, and other historic properties, and has spent most of his career working in cultural resource management, as a Federal government official, in academic programs, and in the private sector. Today he works as a private consultant, mediator, writer

and editor, affiliated with the National Preservation Institute. His work with TIGHAR on the Amelia Earhart project is his recreation. Besides Amelia Earhart's Shoes, the account of TIGHAR's work, King is the author of three textbooks dealing with historic preservation issues and practice, all published by Altamira Press. King lives in



Silver Spring, Maryland, and travels widely in his teaching and consulting practice.

Reaction on ARC Report, Moratorium

February 21, 2008 — Last week's story on the FAA's "51 percent List moratorium" and the Amateur-Built Aviation Rulemaking Committee (ARC) report prompted some questions and comments from EAA members. The most-asked question regarding the moratorium was also the easiest to answer: "Does this moratorium affect previously accepted (approved) kits?"

As we indicate in our <u>Questions and Answers</u> page, no, it does not. The list will remain exactly as is until after FAA publishes its new process revision for determining the major portion (51 percent) for amateur-builts. The FAA has left open the possibility that it may reevaluate some approved kits after posting its new certification policy. EAA is advocating that all aircraft currently on the list should be grandfathered.

Jim Auman, an AB DAR from Illinois, mentioned he had received some calls from kit aircraft builders who thought they would be unable to certificate their finished projects. Auman assured them that this was not the case, telling them, "It (moratorium) does not, in any way, suspend the initial airworthiness certification actions of completed amateur-built kit aircraft. FAA inspectors and DARs are ready to start the certification inspection process for your newly completed aircraft."...

Jeremy Monnett, CEO of Sonex Aircraft, LLC, stated in a recent open letter to the public, "Without necessarily intending it, these professional builders and companies building and selling completed and/or mostly completed aircraft are risking the entire set of Experimental Amateur-Built Rules by continuing to push them beyond their intended boundaries." He adds, "The key to the continued success of the Experimental-Amateur Built rules depends on the consistent enforcement of the rules already in place."

Sam has also won many awards and gained recognition in military and civilian arenas.

A Report from the Georgia Aviation Expo & Conference

I attended one conference session on Friday (Feb. 22) which was an overview of the Georgia Airport system. The presenter was Carol Comer of GDOT (ccomer@dot.ga.gov). Their web-site covers most of what was discussed in the meeting - (http://tomcat2.dot.state.ga.us/Aviation/Home/index.cf m)

One point has come up that may be of interest to the 690 membership regarding legislation before the Georgia House this session that has the potential to affect aviation programs in the state:

HB1019 – Establishes a transportation infrastructure bank. Aviation projects would be included. Allows local airport sponsors to borrow their matching funds and repay with a low interest loan.

HB 1139 – Statewide 1 cent sales and use tax to be used for transportation projects statewide. Would include funding for airport projects.

HR 228 provide that funds derived from sales and use and motor fuel taxes with respect to jet fuel and aviation gasoline shall be allocated for activities incident to providing and maintaining an adequate system of public-use airports in this state;

The text of the bill can be searched on the Georgia Assembly website: www.legis.ga.gov

The site also has a way for members to find their state senators and legislators.

Some of these bills are on the schedule for the coming week.

Marc has received numerous awards, including Best In Show", for "Hell Over the Hadley" at the National Museum of Naval Aviation, 2006 International Juried Exhibition. and "First Place Military", Aviation Week & Space Technology magazine award, 2002 International Juried Aerospace Art Exhibition.

The National Museum of Naval Aviation recently announced Marc Stewart as the recipient of the 2008 R.G. Smith Award for "excellence in naval aviation art." The prestigious honor is awarded annually to a single artist. The Museum's Foundation chooses the recipient. When told of his selection, Marc said "I feel honored to be so recognized for my work. It means a lot to me... For an aviation artist, there's simply no higher honor. It just doesn't get any bigger or better than this. I'm thrilled!"

Unlike a competition or a juried exhibit that may recognize one piece of artwork, the R.G. Smith Award is a career honor, similar to a lifetime achievement award. It will be presented to Marc in Pensacola in May. His work may be viewed online at www.aviationArtbyMarcStewart.com.




