JAARS trip by Chapter 690 by Margaret and Frank Wilcox

Saturday July 12, was a good for our first cross country in the Cessna 150, a flight to JAARS, at Waxhaw, N.C. just south of Charlotte. It was a smooth 2 hour flight from Lenora Field and with the right plane on course we landed at JAARS Townsend field just behind Bob Barton and 3 friends in his Cessna 172. Ken and Sandy Sharpe, Henry Warner and Ron Ehrenberg had flown in Ken's Skylane and were already there to greet us.

Ron was our personal tour he lived and guide since worked at JAARS for 6 years. us to the new guided Townsend Memorial Hall, which houses a large meeting room, cafeteria. administration and media center. There we joined approximately 100, families and church groups that had motored in for the once a month Open House.

We were welcomed Bob Griffin, a JAARS pilot of many years and many experiences in the

jungles of the Third World countries. A slide show presented the story of the work of the Wycliffe Bible Translators. The visitors were divided into smaller groups Each for the tour. was assigned a guide, one of the 250 people who lived near-by and work at the center. Gur puide was Bill Wilson, a retired Air Force Colonel who works in data processing.

All the groups first assembled at the flight line where Bob Griffin gave an amazing demonstration of the Helio Courier in Helio, Ole #1, the first one built. We all were awed (and a bit envious) of take off and climb, hovering, turning and landing capabilities of this aircraft which is so well suited to the kind of flying necessary to support the Wycliffe Bible Translators in their work.

Our tour then took us to the trucking center. JAARS has its own fleet of 18 wheelers that move equipment and machinery, workers household belongings supplies and donated centers and stateside international ports. We saw the radio Comm. Center where radio contact is possible with the most remote Centers all over the world. In the same building the modern is Computer Center.

The tour ended in early afternoon back at the flight line where guests could purchase demonstration flights in the Helio. Ask Bob Barton about his ride!

Our flight back to Lenora Field was slower due to a slight head wind and much rougher due to 95° temperature and many thermals. A cool fall day would be better for another flight to JARRS.
