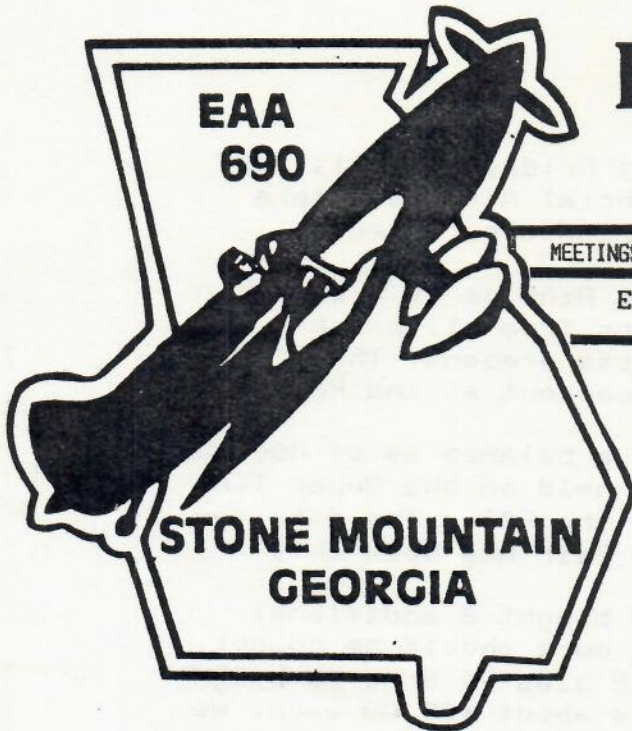

The meeting was officially opened at 8:05 pm by Pres. John Popp. The usual round of introductions from all present was made; there were 24 members and 3 guests present. There was no secretary's report of the August cookout at the Popp's residence, unable to attend.

Harold Stalcup mentioned that he will have the heat sink putty at the next meeting for rent or sale. Cost is \$7.00 per lb., bring your own container.

The discussion on whether Chapter members should also be EAA members was continued from the previous meeting. Also see the recent issues of "NavCom." Our existing by-laws will have to be amended. In order to acquaint all members with the existing bylaws, a copy will be printed in the Oct. "NavCom" so please be prepared to discuss this at our Oct. meeting. The proposed changes will be voted upon at the Nov. meeting.

Our break started at 9:15 and we re-started at 9:35pm. During the break several of the club officers and other members held a brief meeting ; we will learn about it at the Oct. meeting.

Jim Culp, one of our visitors who is a sailplane pilot, invited any and all of us to Chihowee for Oct. 9,10 and 11 for the gliders "Octoberfest." Joel Levine introduced our speaker for the evening; Lawyer Steve Ashby. He can't be all bad, he's working on a VP project. He is also a member of the Association of Sport Aviation Lawyers. They are within the EAA to help define and work out as many of the liability insurance problems as possible.

The meeting was closed at 10:30 pm. The final count was 33 members and guests in attendance.
