President's Message

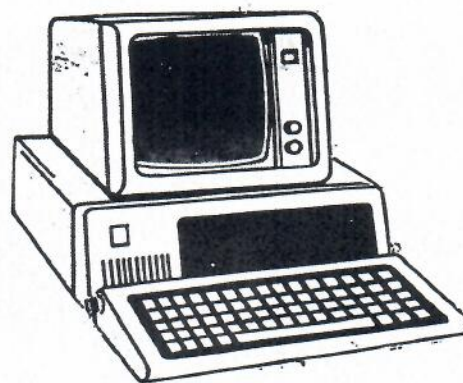
DECEMBER 1985 ISSUE
