Minutes of EAA Chapter 690 June Meeting

Meeting chaired by Vice President David Posey, filling in for traveling President Duane Huff, who has gone west in a quest to win yet another award for the A.W.A.C.

Frank Wilcox, speaking on behalf of the Board of Directors, gave a report on proposed next phase of construction for the chapter meeting hall. A motion was made to approve the recommendation of the Board of Directors to construct a "mezzanine" level at the back of the hangar; the membership voted and approved. Then Frank outlined a funding plan based on members' voluntary purchase of square footage at \$25 per foot. A motion was made to accept this funding plan; membership voted and approved.

Frank also stood in for the Budget and Finance Committee, which suggested that excess funds in chapter treasury (\$4000) be used to repay underwriters who helped fund hangar construction. Some discussion over whether a motion was necessary to repay these funds ensued since possibly the repayment arrangement was already approved back when the chapter first decided to build a hangar. A motion was made to have a vote of confidence for using the \$4000 as a partial repayment to the underwriters. Members voted and approved.

Chapter Airport Liaison Charlie Sego revealed that discussion has started with the airport management concerning the construction of another row of hangars behind the current EAA row (Sport Aviation Center). Charlie has requested that the chapter have first right of refusal on the land behind our hangars if construction is contemplated. Some discussion on the topic of more hangars, with generally a very favorable reaction from the membership. A motion was made for Charlie to proceed with preliminary negotiations with the county. Membership voted and approved.

Wayne Whitaker, Secretary

Bill Coleman gave a report on Young Eagle activities, including a fly-out planned for the following day to Perry Ga., and the Warner Robins Museum. Another Young Eagle rally tentatively planned for Saturday July 19.

Joel Levine urged for volunteers to help out at the chapter airplane wash scheduled for Saturday July 5. Twenty-five bucks to get your machine clean. Despite persistent rumors, absolutely no hooters girls are involved in this event. Joel has flyers to distribute to help publicize the event. Joel also gave a report on the Flying Start Program. Nearly 30 non-pilots have signed up for the program for June 28. Bob Mackie of EAA national will attend. Joel also has flyers advertising our monthly chapter pancake breakfast, which he urges members to distribute.

Treasurer's report:In regular chapter checking account: \$8,657.28 In hangar account: \$35.41; Income for month of May: \$989.40; Outgo for May: \$1,143.16; As of May, the chapter has 95 paid members (82 members, 13 spouses), including five new members recruited last month. Currently 50 non-paid members on the rolls.

David Posey reminded WWI enthusiasts that the second Dawn Patrol Rendezvous will be held at the Air Force Museum in Dayton, Ohio on September 26 & 27, 1998. He also reported that Lawrenceville/Gwinnett County/Briscoe Field has lost its class D airspace classification, and as of July 17, will be considered class G.

VP Posey also urged members to write their congresspersons about proposed aviation user fees in the upcoming federal budget, a bad idea that really needs to be squashed.

Program for the evening was a video on Formula V racing produced by Speedvision.

About the Chapter Hangar

EAA 690 has had a wonderfully busy Spring and early Summer - our new hangar has truly been a happening place in spite of the weather. (Some have been heard to say that we need to schedule some activities next time there's a drought!)

To recount some of our recent successful events: the B-17 visit and Hangar Dance, numerous Young Eagle flight days, a weight and balance seminar, our monthly "first Saturday" pancake breakfasts with associated events (like the poker run and airplane wash) and Georgia's first "Flying Start" seminar. Of course we've had our regular monthly chapter meetings, and numerous board, trustee and committee meetings in the hangar. Future plans include our annual post-Oshkosh gathering, our 2nd annual Community & Aeromart Sale on September 6th, and our 6th Annual Biplane Fall Classic on September 27th.

Our membership is strong and growing. Just "shows to go ya" that if you build it, they will come. Well, we built it - a marvelous new chapter "home base" - and they're coming! Now we need to optomize the facility's usefulness by continuing with our plans.

The Board of Director's and the Chapter Trustees recommended and the membership has approved:

- That we begin to pay back the underwriters who enabled us to construct the hangar without a bank loan.
- That we finalize the plans for the mezzanine, food preparation area, workshop and tool storage section, video library, etc.
- That we proceed with raising funds for this interior construction by "selling" square feet to for \$25 each.

The square feet can be purchased in honor of a friend or family member, to celebrate birthdays and anniversaries, as a memorial, in recognition of a personal milestone (such as a first solo, a project completion, a graduation, promotion, birth of a child or grandchild, etc.) or just to support the Chapter's construction project. We will soon have a display showing purchased square feet for the four phases of the planned project, so that everyone can see our progress towards our goals. Our hope is to have raised the capital and to be ready for Phase I construction by January 1st.

And we're off to a "flying start." The first square feet have been pledged by active chapter members Sherry and Alan Langford. And the donations made in memory of Andy Anderson will be used for a block of square feet. I will be collecting contributions for the purchase of the square feet at our regular monthly meetings and other events, or your checks (to EAA Chapter 690) can be mailed to me at 1340 Nerine Circle, Dunwoody, GA 30338. Please assist with our fundraising campaign so that we can complete the hangar's interior, enabling us to optimize its usefulness to our growing chapter.
