

It's Alive!



Capt Amy Bauernschmidt Taking Over As CO Of Aircraft Carrier USS Abraham Lincoln

Female CO Will Command Aircraft Carrier for First Time.

The Navy confirmed that Capt. Amy Bauernschmidt will assume command of USS Abraham Lincoln (CVN 72) marking the first time a female commanding officer will lead the crew of one of the Navy's 11 nuclear-powered aircraft carriers.

Bauernschmidt will take command of Lincoln this summer, upon completion of the nuclear power, aviation, and leadership training required of aircraft carrier COs.

"I am incredibly honored and humbled to be selected," said Bauernschmidt. "I love leading Sailors and I take that responsibility extremely seriously."

Bauernschmidt was also the first female to serve as the executive officer aboard an aircraft carrier, a position she held from September 2016 to January 2019, also on the Lincoln.

Bauernschmidt is a native of Milwaukee, Wisconsin and graduated from the United Stated Naval Academy in May 1994, the first graduating class in which women were allowed to serve aboard combatant ships and aircraft.

She was designated as a Naval Aviator in 1996 and served with several helicopter squadrons throughout her career. She has previously commanded the "Spartans" of Helicopter Maritime Strike Squadron (HSM) 70 and amphibious transport dock USS San Diego (LPD-22).

Convective SIGMET

A weather advisory concerning convective weather significant to the safety of all aircraft. Convective SIGMETs are issued for tornadoes, lines of thunderstorms, embedded thunderstorms of any intensity level, areas of thunderstorms greater than or equal to VIP level 4 with an area coverage of 4/10 (40%) or more, and hail 3/4 inch or greater.

EAA 690 Youth Aviation Program 2020

Who knew, back in January, what surprises 2020 would have in store for the EAA 690 Youth Aviation Program. After a short hiatus due to COVID, the build started again at the beginning of July. In June we put together a small leadership team to go over the program document and make necessary changes. Most of the changes came from a meeting held early in the year between program mentors and chapter leadership. Those changes were in the program along with a couple of additional changes.

In July we began with a meeting of the youth to talk about the new changes and have some safety training along with going to hangar 6 and talking about rearranging and cleaning up in preparation for resuming the builds. It took a couple of weeks to cleanup and get ready to go again. We saw several of the current youth return and a couple of our previous youth return to the program.

When building resumed, covering of the wing began on the Ultra-Piet under the leadership of Joel Levine. The BD-6 project resumed under Andrews guidance as work continued on controls for the tail surfaces. Work also commenced on the R.C. project under the leadership of Ken Lightner.

At this time, the wing has been covered with a plan to leave one-third of it as-is, two-thirds with UV silver and then paint one-third. This will be done after part of the fuselage is covered. Once that work is complete, the wings will be mounted and control surfaces reconnected in preparation for hanging the plane in hangar 6.

The R.C. Modeling crew has completed the second trainer and has begun work on a third scale Piper Cub. We are also considering what other project we would like to add to the group.

Good progress has been made on the BD-6 controls and cables. Andrew had to take the month of November off to sell his house but is back now.

Ben Quick had his check ride weathered out twice now and is waiting on a slot to try again.

Alex Straka became a Private Pilot on January ,5th. Alex looks forward to flying Young Eagles. He will be our third youth program member to do so. Alex has also spent a lot of time helping to maintain the AeroVenture's fleet, earning credits while doing that.



Harrison has begun his flight training and currently has 13 hours in the logbook and expects to solo soon. We look forward to his continuing progress. Harrison is also a student with Embry Riddle.

For the year, our youth put in four hundred and sixty-three hours. We have thirteen active youth and a waiting list of ten. We look forward to resuming work on the full-size Pietenpol in 2021 and adding new youth to the program. Of course, none of this would be possible without the dedication of our mentors.

A series of predetermined maneuvers for the orderly transfer of an aircraft under instrument flight conditions from the beginning of the initial approach to a landing or to a point from which a landing may be made visually. It is prescribed and approved for a specific airport by competent authority.


