March 1996 Minutes

The March 8, 1996 meeting of EAA Chapter 690 was called to order by President Duane Huff at 8:00PM followed by the introductions of 35 members and 9 guests in attendance.

David Posey introduced speaker Barbara Young, north Georgia EAA Chapter 99 chairperson. Barbara gave a dipicton of Chapter 99, as an international chapter consisting of 7,000 female pilots from 35 countries around the world. It originated on November 2, 1929 in Long Island, New York, during a period when there were only 117 licensed women pilots in the United States. Amelia Airheart was their first president. Barbara spoke on the average members involvment and chapter activities such as the powder puff derby, now known as the air race classic. A video tape of typical chapter activities was shown including a Young Eagles event held by Chapter 99 at Peachtree Dekalb Airport, Amelia Airheart birthday parties, a tour of Lockheed, and at tour of Atlanta Center.

Barbara introduced two other speakers from Chapter 99, they spoke about their experiances flying and chapter activities.

We celebrated Lnor Levine's birthday with a song and cake. HAPPY BIRTHDAY LNOR

New Business:

Duane passed out two ballots, one for the Board of Trustees, and one for the Board of Directors, and asked all members in good standing to vote. Nominations were taken from the floor for additional nominees prior to the vote.

Vice Presidents report was read by David Posey which contained information from EAA National on the future B-17 event scheduled for March 13- 19, 1996. In Bound flight bookings, bookings in general, advertising and the pancake breakfast were discussed.

A dedication ceramony for the EAA chapter hanger was scheduled for Saturday starting at 12:00 noon, including a speech from Steve Ashby, ice cream and cake.

Bob Zahner gave a report on the status of the dinner and dance scheduled for Saturday night 7:00PM in the EAA hanger. Alcoholic beverages will not be served during the function, EAA National has a definite policy regarding the consumtion of alcoholic beverages during a sanctioned EAA event, they will not cover any accidents or casualties due to consumption of alcohol during an event. The motion passed unanimously. Plans for a dance were discussed, no plans for a band were made.

Sherry Langford gave a report on the chapter funds. The total number of paid members in good standing was 41 and 6 spouses, 29 members and four spouses have not renewed.

Two requests to help with the Nav Com were made by Duane, one that all entries be submitted by the 22nd of the month and for volunteers to help Alan Langford with folding, stamping, stapling and mailing the NavCom.

Peter DiTomaso gave the Membership report. He mentioned a membership stand will be set up Saturday during the B-1 event and asked for volunteers at that time.

Our librarian brought the video tapes in, he will be moving them to the EAA hanger for future reference.

Bill Coleman gave the Young Eagles report, the next outing will be Aviation Explorer Scouts scheduled for March 30, 1996 10:AM at the EAA hanger. Fifteen children and 6 pilots have committed to to the rally to date. More pilots and load masters are needed, if you can participate call Bill. In the event the rally is rained out, the date will be postponed one week which will be April 6, 1996.

Greg Jannakos gave the date and time of the project visit (March 9th @ 10:00 AM) in hanger 7, we will be visiting the Atlantis. Fred and his Acro 1made it in Kit Planes magizine last month on page 38. There will be a post Lakeland get together held on April 27, 1996 in the hanger.

Board of Trustees Report

The first meeting of the newly-elected Chapter 690 Board of Trustees was held March 20, 1996. The first order of business was the election of board officers. By unanimous vote, the chairman is Frank Wilcox; Vice Chairman is Bob Zahner, and Recording Secretary is Joel Levine. The remaining members elected at the March chapter meeting are Dennis Kaas, Andy Anderson, and Bob Wilbanks. All were present.

The board discussed in detail its responsibilities as stated in the newly revised chapter by-laws. Two major areas of effort were determined. The first is the preparation of policies and procedures regarding the handling of chapter property. The group will develop an operating handbook as these documents are presented to and approved by the Board of Directors. Suggested topics are acquisition and use of property, care of buildings and grounds, loan of chapter tools, videos, books, etc. and disposal of unneeded property. Each member was asked to develop ideas in this area of responsibility for discussion in future meetings.

The second area of responsibility is the development and or continuation of projects needed to make the chapter building fulfill the prioritized space use that was voted by the membership. One item that will be completed as soon as the weather permits

is painting the floor. All of the material is on hand and paid for to complete this project. It should be finished before any additional construction and before major use of the building.

New items discussed and approved for presentation to the Board of Directors for implementation are the replacement of the failed instant water heater, the building of the "hard" walls on approximately 100 feet of the interior of the building to protect the plastic-covered insulation, and construction of a mezzanine storage area at the rear of the building. Planning will start for a food preparation area, tool storage room, and lounge/library/office area.

Following our meeting, the three approved items were presented to the Board of Directors. Authorization and the required funding was given to immediately move on these projects. Work days will be announced when materials are available.

Members of the Board of Trustees are always willing to discuss the above programs as well as new ideas. Chapter members are encouraged to discuss their thoughts with trustees. The Chapter Building is a chapter project in which all should take a personal interest.






