Remembering Ron Alexander

Comment from Randy Epstein

As most of you know the aviation world lost Ron Alexander on Thursday, November 17th. Ron was giving rides in the restored Jenny when something went terribly wrong causing the Jenny to crash taking Ron's life and that of an FAA employee.

It is hard to put into words all that Ron meant to aviation and all that he put into aviation. We will still look forward to the special events at the Peachstate Aerodrome, but they will not seem the same without Ron's smiling face there to greet us.

The aviation community mourns the loss of Ron R. Alexander, who was killed on Thursday, November 17, while flying his Curtiss Jenny near the Candler Field Museum/Peach State Airport in Williamson, Georgia.

Born in 1942 in Bloomington, Indiana, Alexander soloed an Aeronca Champ at the age of 16. From there Alexander climbed the ratings ladder by instructing ROTC cadets before entering the Air Force in 1964. While serving our country Alexander flew the de Havilland Caribou, supplying Special Forces troops in Vietnam and earned the rank of captain before leaving the Air Force in 1969.

Alexander joined Delta airlines in 1969 and flew an assortment of jets as a captain before retiring in 2002 with 34 years of service. While flying for Delta, he became enamored with vintage airplanes and began a love affair with these historic treasures. From Stearmans to Cubs to DC-3s, Alexander's greatest love was sharing the joy and beauty of flight with young and old alike.

Alexander founded the Alexander Aeroplane Company in 1979, supplying material to aircraft builders and restorers. In 1993, he created the "SportAir Workshops," which have opened the doors to countless homebuilders and restorers by giving them hands-on educational experience in the art of building an airplane with an assortment of materials. In 1999, Alexander sold SportAir Workshops to EAA, which carries on that tradition and Alexander's vision today.

In 1992, Alexander purchased Stits Poly-Fiber, Inc., manufacturing the Poly-Fiber covering process and remained president of that company until 2002. He was also a regular contributor to EAA Sport Aviation and EAA Vintage Airplane magazines writing technical articles for homebuilders and antique aircraft restores.



Steve R. Champness has been the President of the Atlanta Aero Club for 16 years, A chapter of the National Aeronautics Association and National Advertising Sales Director at "Trade-a-Plane" a worldwide distributed buy / sell aircraft publication where he has worked for 25 years, Steve is an enthusiastic Private Pilot with more than 500 hours flight time and has owned two aircraft in partnerships and is looking for the next "perfect plane arrangement" locally. Steve has more than 2000 flight hours in P-3 Orion Navy Patrol aircraft as Assistant Flight Engineer tracking soviet submarines during the Cold War era..



Previously Mr. Champness was Director of Marketing and Sales for"Dalfort

Training" in Dallas TX, and helped to start a chain of Part 147 A&P training Schools. National Advertising Sales Executive at "FAPA's Career Pilot Magazine" for 6 years. Prior to that three years selling at the at ROBB REPORT magazine

Became President of the Atlanta Aero Club in 2001 (Regional Chapter of National Aeronautics Association) has worked to promote the aviation Industry in Georgia. The Atlanta Aero Club has over 230 active individual and business members and the popular luncheon speaker program series attracts attendees and speakers from across the country. Speakers include Joe Lombardo, Gulfstream, Former Governor Sonny Perdue, Delta Airline President Ed Bastian, Cirrus Aircraft co-founder Alan Klapmeier and FAA Administrator Randy Babbitt to name a few.

Steve authored the original" Proclamation Supporting Aviation" and declaring May 2009 "Aviation Month". Governor Perdue was the first to endorse it and signed it in a ceremony at the Georgia State Capital in Atlanta. Approximately 48 State Governors nationwide have now signed similar proclamation's supporting aviation for their own states.

Through the Atlanta Aero Club Mr. Champness conceived the Georgia Air Challenge in 2011 that encouraged pilots to get active again by offering prizes for pilots that flew the required amount in 40 days and registered online at the official GAC web site. Over 300 Georgia Pilots participated creating a surge in aviation activity and economic activity even during the height of the economic recession.

A seven year Naval Veteran and received an Honorable Discharge, Battle E Award and Naval Aircrewman Wings while serving in several Navy Patrol Squadrons flying the P-3B Orion. Experience includes 2000+ hours as Assistant flight Engineer, tracking Russian Submarines and Warships worldwide during the "Cold War era" and USN Jet Engine Aviation Machinists Mate rating.

Steve is a active Board Member of the National Aeronautics Association (NAA) and has served on the Collier Trophy Selection Committee numerous times. a strong supporter for Georgia's Aerospace Industry Nominees. Steve was a strong advocate within NAA for The Lockheed F-22 Raptor and the Gulfstream G-650 aircraft, both of which both went on to win the coveted Collier Trophy.

Also President of the Peachtree DeKalb Airport Association for 8 years Mr. Champness successfully attracted the National Aviation Business Association Convention Static Display to DeKalb Peachtree Airport in 1993 and 1999.

Steve enjoys flying and all thing Aviation, Atlanta league Tennis, Boating at Lake Lanier and is a member of, AOPA, NBAA, EAA, Warbirds of America, Commemorative Air Force Dixie Wing and Angel Flight of Georgia. Steve and Nancy Petroline, also a Private Pilot have been together for 17+ years.

Steve was honored to receive the "Georgia Aviation Hall of Fames Chairman's Award" in April of 2016 at award dinner Delta Airlines Museum for his work to benefit the Aviation Community in Georgia. The is only the Eighth Time this discretionary award has been given since the Georgia Aviation Hall of Fame was created by Governor Joe Frank Harris in 1988.
