If you haven't heard already, and I'm sure most Chapter 690 members have, President Duane Huff's "Award Winning Aeronca Chief" was judged Classic Division *Grand Champion* at Sun 'n' Fun '96. A few months ago, the Chief, a little bit shinier and with many less air miles, was judged Classic Division Best of Class at Oshkosh '95. Two top awards in less than a year! Dreams, with hard work, do come true!

As Duane and I sat there in the FAA Forum room and watched the many awards being made for Warbirds, Ultralights, and Contemporary Aircraft, the hope was of course that the Chief might win one of the Classic Aircraft awards. The judges had been impressed when they looked the plane over and Duane had shown them pictures and explained how the restoration was done. To enhance the presentations at the Awards Night Celebration, a colored slide of each winner was projected on a large screen as the plane and owner were announced. Winners were announced for Best Custom, Best of Type, Best Finnish, Best Restored, Judge's Choice, yet. still Duane's Chief did not appear on the screen. The head classic judge, who was presenting the awards, said, "and the last award in the Classic Division, the Grand Champion is..." and on the screen flashed a very good 3/4 front view of Duane's plane, "an Aeronca Chief owned by Duane Huff of Lawrenceville, Georgia." understatement for the expression that registered on Duane's face, but after a few seconds, he pulled himself together and "floated" to the stage (still unbelieving, I think), accepted his award, and "floated" back to his seat. Wow! The hoped for, but unexpected, had happened.

A round of congratulations followed the awards presentations. We all went out for dinner with former Chapter 690 member Steve Dunn and his friends. Steve now lives in Dallas. He too was a top award winner one year with his restored L-19 that many of us envied and occasionally flew in. It was quite an evening of reminiscing—an appropriate conclusion to all of the excitement we had just experienced.

I don't know if the Chief knew that it was so famous, but I do know that on the flight home the next day, everything went like clockwork. The landings were smoother, the airspeed a little higher (or was it the ground speed, Duane), and she flew straight on the GPS planned flight path—from airport to airport. Maybe it was payback to Duane for all of his hard work and persistence in bringing a tired old 1947 Aeronca Chief back to a new life. It is a new life that is recognized by expert and amateurs alike as "the Classic Grand Champion" of Sun 'n' Fun '96, the second largest worldwide gathering of aviation enthusiasts Congratulations Duane and Aeronca Chief NG 3420E.
