NOTAM (notice to airmen) is the title I have chosen for my monthly NAVCOM column. Not only is NOTAM a familiar aviation term but also NOTAMs provide information dealing with facilities, services and procedures needed for successful flight. (By substituting chapter progress for flight, NOTAM as a title is just about right.) These monthly NOTAMs will comment on the planning, progress and results of our chapter activities; recognize members efforts in our accomplishments and (I hope) increase interest and participation in our activities.

Significant changes have occurred in Chapter 690 during the last few years. 
