Many of the membership will be at the airport on Friday afternoon setting up displays for the Airshow. If you can help on Friday afternoon it will be appreciated.

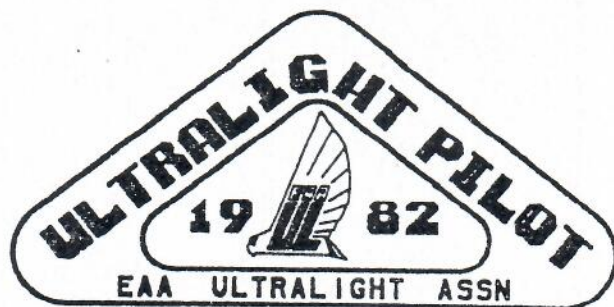
