Carter Wood will be our guest speaker on Friday, July 11th. He is a US Army Veteran, a Military History Enthusiast and has retired from the military, the corporate world and as an educator.

He is a Council Commissioner of the Northeast Georgia Boy Scouts of America, he is the State Vice President of the Sons of the American Revolution and President of the Fort McPherson Chapter of the National Sojourners.

Colditz is ‘DerSonderlager’-Bad Boys Jail’-was supposedly a maximum security camp for WWII POW’s who had escaped from other prisons. It had more break out attempts than any other POW camp

in Europe. He will also have photos and details from his tour of the 16th century castle taken just a few months ago. Join us for what sounds to be a very interesting topic.
