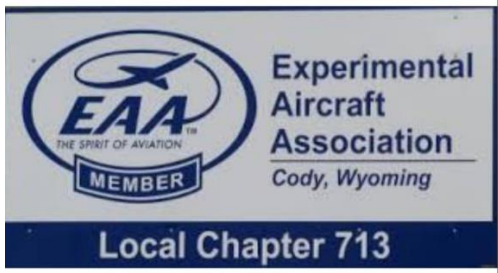
Rebuilders Week – Online Event **Starts January 27th**

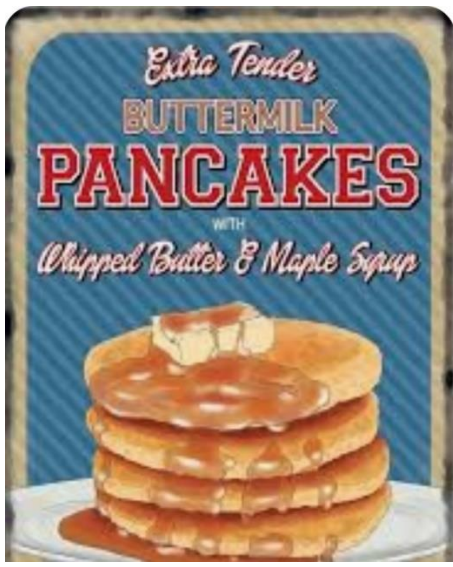
