

Secretaries Report:

EAA 713 Board minutes Nov 26 -Mike Bond opened the meeting and John Stephan, Karl Lampe, John Brouillette, Suzanne Stephan and Chuck Walker were present. Fred Breish briefly attended and mentioned that he has EAA CHAPTER 713 pictures to share for this months' newsletter. October board meeting minutes were read and approved. Karl Lampe treasury report: EAA Scholarship fund has\$1,728.75; the general checking account has \$13,047.70. The chapter has \$1140 to complete matching funds of \$10,000 for the scholarship program. Elections for new board members, the Scholarship Committee members and a new Safety Officer took place during November 12 dinner meeting. The new board is as follows: President, Ken Foote: Vice President John Stephan, Treasure, Karl Lampe, Board Secretary Suzanne Stephan. The Scholarship committee consists of Tom Blake, Bill Schneider, and Dave Gianakos. Jim LaRowe is the new safety officer, and John Brouillette will also contribute to this program. Chuck reported that EAA Chapter 713 has a total of 69 members. He stated that three T-hangars are available, and that not being able to obtain a waiver for insurance coverage was an issue. Chuck mentioned that having an EAA member join the YRA board would help promote issues relevant to general aviation.

Scholarship news was discussed, and the board formally approved a new \$5000 scholarship for Josie Griebel multiengine training. That scholarship request was voted on during the November 12 dinner meeting. John Brouillette stated that the January meeting will have a safety Officer presentation on the need for a "sterile cockpit" (a term from commercial aviation) so that pre-checks are completed before flight, and other considerations. About 40 people will attend the Christmas Dec. 10 meal at the Terrace. There is no board meeting in December. January board meeting is Jan. 28.
