
EAA 713 Club Officers

Jan. 28, 2025 Board meeting minutes Ken Foote opened the meeting. Chuck Walker, Bill Schneider, John Brouillette, Jim LaRowe, were present. Karl Lampe and John Stephan were absent. -Board secretary read the November 2024 minutes, and a correction was made regarding the Scholarship committee members; Ted Ajax is replacing Dave Gianakos as the third member of the committee. The board approved the minutes.

-Treasurer report was presented by Ken F -EAA Checking account total is \$11,491.45, EAA scholarship fund total is \$4,500.75. Bill S noted that these totals might not reflect a \$1,000 donation by two EAA members, and also a top EAA donor might be contributing another \$10,000 for matching scholarship funds for 2025. The board approved the treasury report. Chuck W noted that a tax related letter needs to be sent to any contributor for an amount \$200. -Jim L and John B want EAA members to participate in the safety briefing at the dinner meeting so everyone can learn from the experiences and knowledge of others. Safety topic for February is carburetor fires. -Two new EAA members are taking over tasks previously done by Chuck W - Tanner Paulsen will act as web master for chapter data, and Pere Davison will take over the membership duties. Coordinating information between National EAA and EAA Chapter 713 to make data updates more efficient was discussed by the board.

-A policy that the monthly newsletter is not mailed to members who have not paid annual chapter dues was discussed. Ken F suggested this policy change so members remain involved in chapter activities and maybe participate more actively.

-Chuck W advised of new YRA board membership and concerns were raised that general aviation issues need more representation. Members agreed that regular communication with Park County Board of Commissioners and Cody City Council is necessary to promote general aviation issues. -Bill S reported that the Scholarship committee met with Josephine Griebel regarding additional funding for her CFI and Double II training. The committee agreed to give her an additional \$5,000; this passed unanimously by the board.

-Ken F introduced a leadership idea that includes a three-year commitment rotating between three positions – board president, vice president and scholarship chairman. This idea exposes many facets of chapter leadership to the membership.


