VICE-PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

As we look back over this past year, there's been many changes and losses that we've experienced together. I'm going to start with one of our most recent events. As many of you are aware, Jim fell from a ladder at his home very recently. He was released from the hospital Thursday and should be recovering at home now. He broke his spine in two places; his lower back and his neck, which involved four different vertebrae. He's been recovering at St. Francis Hospital by Powers and Woodmen and lost his phone while there, which is one of the reasons a lot of us have been unable to talk with him recently. I doubt that loss of contact will last very long once he gets settled and gets a new phone. He needs our prayers and support as he continues his physical therapy and returns to our chapter. Give him a call at home once he gets settled, I know he's anxious to talk to everyone.

We started the year strongly with our membership renewals, just as we do every year. But as that was concluding, we lost one of our most beloved Chapter members. I don't know how everyone has dealt with the loss of Esther Smith, but it hit me especially hard. I had visited Esther just a couple of days before she was gone. Her spirit was high, but she was frustrated with being stuck there for her treatments and rehab. Since then, we've had to lean on each other and spread out her duties, it's taken several chapter members to step up and fill those shoes. She did so many things for this chapter, not the least of which was her secretary position on the Board. She managed tracking our membership, a major portion of the cooking, all the inventory for our food supplies, she managed the kitchen with an iron fist, and most of all she kept us all on our toes. I don't know if everyone is aware, but Jeff has elected to move onto greater things and is passing the torch to Raquel Dominguez. Raquel will be taking over for all of Jeff's duties in organizing and running our Young Eagles program. If you haven't yet met Raquel, she's heavily involved in aviation and will be a fantastic asset to our chapter moving forward. I can't think of better hands to leave the Young Eagles program to.

We had a tremendous showing for our annual Chili cookoff last month. We had eight fantastic entries. Richard Martin took first place, Doug Dal Soglio took second place, and Greg Sipes took third place. We elected a new Secretary to our board. So, I'd like to give a very warm welcome to Alec Hamilton for volunteering to be our new Secretary. Please congratulate him on this position when you run into him in the future.

As many of you are aware, there was a large physical change to the MLAA hangar back in September and October. So please join me in thanking the MLAA Board and Aerolab for help in organizing and financing the repair to the MLAA hangar. We've already seen a decrease in our utilities from those repairs. The building is now secure, and we can trust in many years of use from these efforts. We still have a few smaller projects to tackle over the next year, updating the south and west exterior first floor doors are at the top of that list.

We had a wonderful Christmas party this year on 7 Dec 2024. We're incredibly lucky that we had another volunteer that stepped up to be our Event Coordinator, Heidi Ingalls. Our Christmas Party would have been a shell of success this year, had it not been for Heidi's tremendous efforts. She spearheaded the efforts in organizing and purchasing many of our supplies, desserts, and food. The last couple of Christmas Parties we've had were hosted at the Patty Jewett golf course. Those parties got pricey over time, and many of you indicated to the board that we needed to do something about that cost. We listened to and decided to host it at the MLAA Hangar this year. We had initially planned to have the party in the hangar, and if we had had more people, then we would have been forced to do that. There were 50 people initially signed up for the party and four of those were unable to attend. We instead decided to have the party upstairs where we normally meet. We requested help cleaning and setting up, and there was a huge show of volunteers for that effort. I can't thank you all enough for volunteering.

We elected to have the food provided by Honey Baked Ham. The menu consisted of two large spiral cut hams, two platters of roasted turkey breast, one platter of smoked turkey breast, Maple Sweet Potato Soufflé, Tuscan-style Broccoli, Green Bean Casserole, Cheesy Potatoes Au Gratin, and Hawaiian sweet rolls. The desserts were a large platter of cookies, a dozen gluten free donuts, Apple, Pumpkin, and mixed berry pies. Volunteer of the Year is awarded to Patty Martin for selflessly stepping up to cover the loss of Esther and continuing in that role until we managed to find her replacement last month. Patty's many other efforts are for helping with hosting the IMC/VMC meetings and setting up our A/V for our many meetings. She was never elected as Secretary but fulfilled those duties wonderfully and continued to do so until a new Secretary was elected last month.

Member of the Year has been awarded to Jeff Hyatt for his enormous efforts in hosting and running our Young Eagles events this past year. We will miss him and wish him all the best in this next chapter of his life.

Pete Gonzales Spirit of the Year is awarded to Richard Martin. Richard was initially slated for Member of the year, and this was discussed with several members of the board. I swapped that out at the last minute because I believe that one of the cornerstones for Experimental Aviation is training; even while building, we're training and learning. Richard's devotion to our Chapter's training programs, IMC/VMC and now the Simulator, have shown his diligence in putting together a comprehensive training program that any chapter would be proud of. He truly embodies the spirit of aviation.

Lifetime Achievement Award was awarded posthumously to Esther Smith. Jim and I discussed this, and we both agreed that we don't have to award this every year. We also agreed that it needs to be for someone who truly shines in aviation and our Chapter. So, I put forth this proposal to the Christmas Party attendees, as potential recognition,

and I received overwhelming endorsement by everyone there. Esther was a cornerstone to our Chapter in so many ways and it's important for future members to know the legacy she leaves behind. She cared deeply for this Chapter, and it showed in her passion for doing things the right way, even if you couldn't see that immediately or at that moment.
