System. At the top of the page is a **"SignUp"** link. Click on it and fill out the registration form. You can use the same name and password as for the EAA website. Please make sure your registration denotes that you are a member of Chapter 723. This must be done so that we can get the appropriate waivers signed by both the pilots and passengers.

This is the first time we have attempted to do an open house for the public and it is important that the entire chapter participate!

Again the Learn to Fly Day event is Saturday May 21, 2022 from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. It is one more opportunity to bring new people into general aviation and our Chapter.
