




The House that Jack Built by Charlie Heathco

I had gotten a description of aprox where he lived near Powell, Mo. from him some time ago, and had found his place on google maps. Well I thought I would take a run up there and see if he was ok. His place is a big round underground house on the edge of a really big creek. He needs to take it to Neosho to assemble wings. I want to tell a little about the house that Jack built, very impressive. (big) The beams are massive, and he actually had a big cat dozer running around on them while covering with dirt. He has an indoor pool on south side behind a big bank of windows.
