












There was also an Aeronca Defender that crashed the party.

Skyraider Project Update

The SkyRaider is a kit, designed for the ultralight option if desired. This plane will be an LSA. Wingspan: 27', Chord: 3'10", length: 16'. My EW is 440 lbs, including projected weight of fabric and paint. The engine is an 4A084 Military Standard Engine, manufactured by Teledyne and normally shrouded and cooled by a crankshaft fan. The engine is used to power pumps and generators. Strip all the extra stuff off and you're left with what you see in the picture. Weight about 140 lbs, 39 hp, no starter, single magneto ignition, direct drive to the prop. Made to run on low grade gasoline. It is heavier than the Rotax 447, 277, or 532 two stroke engines the designer had in mind for the airplane, and I had to add weight aft to bring the CG into range. I have been working on the project off and on for nine years or so, a source of great amusement to those who have followed the project. Fabric covering has been completed using the Stewart System, and it was not nearly the horrendous ordeal I feared it would be. Prepping for paint now, latex acrylic(!), and a flight test hopefully will follow. The project is underway at Sam's Aircraft at the Springdale Airport, and anyone who is interested is most welcome to contact me and come by for a visit. I welcome any excuse to take a break from paint prep. I'd like to add that I'm immensely grateful to Sam Cordey and all those who have been so generous with their help. <u>jimjer@cox.net</u> 479.200.4609
