Young Eagles Online Registration Tool Rebuild

As was documented in the January 2024 newsletter, the Young Eagles Online Registration system (known as Young Eagles Day) is undergoing a major rebuild.

The project is progressing very nicely, & I'm excited for the launch of this new tool. Though the new system will retain 85-90 percent of its current functionality, there will still be a beta test period to work through the kinks. The beta test is set to take place this April through June. EAA has identified roughly 18 chapters to participate in the beta test.

Following the beta phase, EAA is targeting a go-live date in mid-June after International Young Eagles Day. To assist with the go-live, EAA will be migrating all the current user profiles, as well as producing updated training materials.

Since there is a natural planning period, the new online tool will run in parallel with Young Eagles Day for a few weeks. This will allow chapters with upcoming/outstanding events in Young Eagles Day to successfully close out events. Young Eagles Day will likely be shut down just prior to EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2024.

To assist with the full transition, Young Eagles coordinators can expect an additional email from EAA outlining the transition plan in further detail.

EAA Learn to Fly Week Inspires Future Pilots on May 13-18

Aspiring pilots can kick-start their aviation journey as [EAA Learn to Fly Week](#) returns on May 13-18. The six-day event enters its second year with expanded webinar offerings, and new topics to explore. Learn to Fly Week is supported by Sporty's.

"Learning to fly can seem like a daunting task at first," said David Leiting, EAA Eagles Program manager, "but EAA's Learn to Fly Week will help the

dream remain larger than any hurdles."

Learn to Fly Week begins with 15 webinars scheduled over the first five days, May 13-17. EAA staff members and industry experts will be hosting each webinar. New topics for 2024 include getting started with helicopters, aircraft options for flight training, and training with FAA-approved flight simulators. All webinars are free to attend, but online pre-registration is required.

The week concludes on Saturday, May 18, with EAA Flying Start programs held at numerous chapters throughout the country. At those locations, prospective pilots can connect with the local aviation community, discover flight training opportunities available in their area, and take a free introductory Eagle Flight as part of EAA's program for adults that connects them with aviation resources.

We arrived at the Vibrant Arena at The MARK in Moline, IL at approximately 5:15 PM, home of the Quad City Storm (SPHL) & Quad City Steamwheelers (Indoor Football League), and checked-in at Guest Services, which is located near the box office windows. We were greeted by Ann Boyd, Corporate Sales, Quad City Storm and allowed to ride the elevator to get to our spot just outside section 109 on the concourse. We were presented with excellent instruction from Ann Boyd on how Chuck-a-Puck works, how the transaction system works, and how we may walk the entire arena selling Chuck-a-Pucks.

How does Chuck-a-Puck work? Chuck-a-Puck is a fun way to win some really cool prizes during the second intermission! Fans who have purchased a Chuck-a-Puck will throw their puck onto the ice aiming for the center jackpot bucket or other targets. The pucks that go in the bucket or land nearest the target will receive a prize. The prizes that the Chuck-a-Puck thrower can receive, thanks in large part to Storms' generous donors and sponsors come from Hawaiian Bros. Island Grill, Hooters, Nothing Bundt Cakes, Papa Johns, QDOBA Mexican Eats, Rock Island Optometric Center, and a free round of golf at TPC Deere Run. However, the Storm ended up winning the game 5-3 in front of 3,618 fans to end their four-game losing streak against their in-state rivals. At the 14:22 mark of the third period, Jake Maynard, a defenseman with seven professional hockey league games under his belt, scored his first professional goal. The goal he scored ended up being the game winner as well. What a night for the young 26-year-old. Other goal scorers for the Storm were Cole Golka, Leiff Mattson, Tom Tsicos and Alex Pommerville. The goal scorers for the Rivermen were Renat Dadadzhyanov, JM Piotrowski, and Braydon Barker.

John served six years from 1989-1995 as an Avionics Technician on General Dynamics F-111 Aardvarks and Lockheed C-5 Galaxies. As part of Operation Desert Storm/Operation Desert Shield, John supported the Northern No-Fly Zone in Iraq. After his military career, he went to Cobham as an Assembly Technician. In his free time, one of his hobbies is that he likes to play ice hockey.

Liz and Summer were instrumental in setting this up after being approached by Ann Boyd, Corporate Sales Manager Vibrant Arena & Quad City Storm. Ann informed EAA Chapter 75 that the Quad Cities International Airport (MLI/KLMI) hosted the night’s hockey game and the airport’s Executive Director Ben Leischner named EAA Chapter 75 as the Chuck-a-Puck fundraising beneficiary. Without them, none of this would have been possible. We raised \$1,163.50 during this fundraising effort. All proceeds were donated to our chapter to support youth programs, specifically, enough money was raised to send one student to EAA Air Academy for a week over the summer.
