Ray Scholarship 2024

Jenny Wilson, our Ray Scholarship Coordinator, submitted to EAA, our chapter's application for a full Ray Scholarship in 2024. Due to our previous Ray Scholar success, we believe we are very competitive to receive a full \$11,000 scholarship from EAA. We expect EAA headquarters to notify us by the end of March.

But that doesn't mean we are waiting until then to assess our student candidates for 2024. Our Chapter Scholarship Committee had their initial meeting on December 12th to establish application timelines and submission requirements. If you're a student, or know of one, between the ages of 16-19 and are interested in competing for the Ray Scholarship, we recommend the following steps:

- Attend our Chapter Gathering on Feb. 3rd to hear from Dr. James Blum, an FAA Aeromedical Examiner

3. Sign up to attend our TEEN Flying Start event on Feb 10th (see below for details)

Most important note: We are accepting online applications NOW through February 16, 2024.

TEEN Flying Start Event

This past May, our chapter hosted eight adults for a one-day event to welcome, inspire, and educate those aspiring aviators about their pathway to becoming a pilot. Later in September, our chapter participated in the Girls in Aviation Day event at the Quad Cities International Airport where we met several young women interested in learning to fly...but didn't know where to start. It became apparent to those few members involved with both events that we should organize a TEEN Flying Start event for those young adults and their parents to outline the same pathway to becoming a pilot.

On February 10th, our chapter will host a TEEN Flying Start event at the Davenport Municipal Airport. This event is for our young adults between ages 15-17 and their parents / guardians. We will outline the steps required to become a pilot, local flight school options, average costs, scholarship opportunities, and some Q&As with some of our local Flight Instructors. Most importantly, and the reason for the age range, we will discuss how to be most competitive for our Chapter's Ray Scholarship. This will be a can't miss event!

30 Years of Young Eagles in the Books

2023 has been a banner year for the EAA Young Eagles program, and it is all thanks to our tremendous volunteers! There has been an abundance of success stories of Young

Eagles going on to pursue a future in aviation, and several volunteer pilots met incredible milestones such as 1,000, 2,000, and even 3,000 total Young Eagles flown.

One of the most exciting notes I can share is that 2023 has the potential be the strongest year for Young Eagles activity since 2015. There are still plenty of waivers/registration forms to be entered, but we are eagerly awaiting the final numbers. Through the first 10 months of 2023, more Young Eagles have been flown than in all of 2022.

Annual Young Eagles Flight Activity

- 2019 59,016
- 2020 8,006
- 2021 35,590
- 2022 53,776
- 2023 53,805 YTD

The Young Eagles 30 for 30 challenge was a high-light of the first half of 2023. 477 volunteer pilots met the challenge of flying 30 Young Eagles in celebration of the Young Eagles 30th anniversary!

From January 1 to July 31, 2023, EAA offered double Young Eagles Credits to encourage more flight activity during the 30th anniversary celebration. I am thrilled to share that during that period, nearly \$350,000 of Young Eagles Credits were earned!

Young Eagles Online Registration Tool Rehuild

The Young Eagles online registration tool (currently known as <u>YEDay.org</u>) has been in place for a little more than five years. In that time, it has exploded in popularity. In 2023, approximately three-quarters of Young Eagles flown were registered using this system.

Thanks to the efforts of Don White, EAA Lifetime 570212, the tool has evolved over time to include many invaluable bells and whistles. Everything from email management, rally timeslots, certificate printing capabilities, EAA member/YPP verification, overnight uploads to the EAA database, and now integration with the EAA Digital Signature App. Thank you Don for your dedication to the tool!

Since the tool's inception, it has been maintained solely by Don. Don has done a great job supporting the tool and has always been there to assist chapters in need. However, if for any reason Don was unable to support the system, EAA and EAA members would be left without a dedicated IT support team.

Plus, Don White deserves more free time to finish his Velocity and enjoy flying the Florida coast!

These factors, coupled with the massive growth in usage, has led EAA to put together a more robust support system. The EAA Young Eagles and IT teams in Oshkosh have spent the past 12 months evaluating the best options for moving the tool to an EAA-supported platform. Where we have landed is working with a third-party vendor to rebuild the tool from the ground up.

Fear not, all the functionality you have come to know and love will be retained, along with the addition of a few new features. This rebuild has also provided EAA the opportunity to streamline certain components of the system.

At the time of writing this message, the rebuild is in the early stages. The target launch date is late March/early April 2024. After initial launch, there will be a beta test window before the tool is fully launched for use across the entire chapter network.

In the lead up to the launch, EAA will provide a full transition plan to Young Eagles coordinators. This will include when the official transition will occur, how to handle upcoming events, the transition of user profiles, and of course the entirely new training program.

Our main priorities during this transition are as follows:

- Prevent any service interruptions to chapters
- Retain the primary user experience, as to not require retraining for current users
- Update the look and feel of the tool
- Create stronger integration with EAA databases to provide a more holistic Young Eagles resource
- Streamline some processes to lessen the learning curve for new users
- Ensure a robust support system is in place for the tool. This includes training documentation and dedicated support from EAA HQ

The EAA Ray Aviation Scholarship is a scholarship program that is funded by the Ray Foundation, managed by EAA, and administered through EAA Chapter 75. The Ray Aviation Scholarship provides *up to \$11,000* to support a student's private pilot license training. If selected, the Ray Scholarship funding will be processed from the chapter treasurer to the student's flight instructor / school. The student / parents don't receive direct fuming.

EAA Chapter 75 is accepting applications until February 16th, 2024.

Initial Eligibility Requirements

- Age 16-19 for powered flight training
- Possession of FAA medical certificate (private pilot students)
- Possession of a student pilot certificate
- Be able to begin flight training within 60 days of receiving the award
- Must be able to volunteer for Chapter service a minimum of 2 hours per month
- Must be able to schedule at least 3 flight lessons per week

Application Evaluation

EAA Chapter 75's Ray Scholarship Committee will evaluate students who meet the above minimum requirements to determine the best candidate for the Scholarship. The evaluation factors will include, but not limited to:

- Application, Essay, and In-Person Interview
- Volunteer Work & Involvement in Chapter 75 Events
- Completion of Young Eagles Flight Plan
- School Academic Advisor Evaluation

Additionally, EAA Chapter 75 will ask that parents/guardians be current members of both EAA Chapter 75 and EAA national organizations.




