Also, it is more convent just to taxi over to runway 21 to depart. This would put you out over the clear,

now harvested corn and bean fields. This would also be a better location for an emergency landing. These are just trying to give you some examples, and I hope you had fun flying this month. The Taylorcraft BC-12D which I fly, will have completed its annual by the time you receive this month's newsletter - you should get your annual soon if you haven't already done this.


A Taste of France

June 2018 found Uta and me, in Le Gua, near Royan Mèdis, as guests of our friends, Caroline and John Brennan (of SeaRey fame). The temperatures were 'warm' in the high 90'sF and on occasion in to the 100'sF. Having spent one sweltering day fixing the hydraulics on John's Astra convertible we felt a day of adventure was deserved. The ladies had announced their intention to go shoe shopping so John and I decided to visit Bagnères-de-Luchon. Why there? Hadn't been before, known as challenging and, possibly, cooler.



Bagnères, at one time, required PPR, so given our limited French we got the very helpful controller in Royan-Mèdis to call and check – PPR not required. Rolled in Royan and rolled and rolled – high temperatures greatly effect performance! Lifted and had a much closer look at the perimeter hedge than normal. Beautiful views down the estuary.



We seem to have been too busy, too hot or too interested in the view to take many photos! Routed southwards with great flight following French style. As we arrived at the Pyrenees we got to play 'spot the valley' even with Sky Demon this concentrated the mind. Sky Demon is widely used in Europe rather like Foreflight.

Picked the right valley and hugging the right hand side we routed towards the towering snow flecked Pyrenees. The valley meanders so blind turns were the order of the day. Copious sweat was not only due to the temperatures. John watched the clearance on the right wing tip as I scanned for gliders and other aircraft. The overhead cross join is slightly unusual especially on the approach plate but in the air it all makes perfect sense. We had a southerly headwind on the way down but, luckily, John spotted the windsock, indicating northerly, as we routed overhead. Tight turn over the town watching the stall and an easy landing on a smooth grass strip.



Lunch was the next order of the day. The restaurant was only a couple of hundred metres away but a stream blocked our route. We walked north to a bridge and by the time we arrived it was after 2. Monsieur welcomed us and we asked if we could get some lunch Monsieur said "Oui", but Madame in the kitchen issued an unequivocal "Non La cuisine est fermée".

Luckily we chatted on and when Madame realised we

were Irish she announced the kitchen had miraculously reopened (we were near Lourdes!) with an interrogatory "chaud ou froid?" (hot or cold). Two bulging pains [breads] emerged stuffed with pork, tomatoes and other munchies. To our



embarrassment we were unable to finish them.

Get Your Tickets

This year, we're honored to host Robert L. "Hoot" Gibson as the keynote speaker. "Hoot" was born in Cooperstown, New York, on October 30, 1946, but considers Lakewood, California, his hometown. He first entered active duty in 1969 as a naval aviator. Gibson began his fighter pilot career in VF-111 and VF-1 and served aboard the aircraft carriers USS Coral Sea and USS Enterprise. He flew combat missions over the skies of Southeast Asia in the F-4 Phantom. He would later make the first operational carrier deployment of the F-14 Tomcat. Gibson then graduated from the Navy Fighter Weapons School, commonly referred to as "TOPGUN."

Hoot was selected by NASA in 1978 and graduated as an astronaut in 1979. He flew five missions — STS-41-B on the space shuttle Challenger, STS-61-C on Columbia, STS-27 on Atlantis, STS-47 on Endeavor, and STS-71 when he docked Atlantis with the Mir space station for the first time. Gibson served as the Chief of the Astronaut Office from 1992-1994, and then was the Deputy Director, Flight Crew Operations in 1996.

Gibson's amazing career has touched every part of aviation. He has served as a commercial airline pilot, air racing pilot, warbird pilot, and avid model builder. He has flown 111 different types of aircraft. He is married to astronaut Dr. M. Rhea Seddon.

Up for sale is a 1989 Viking Dragonfly Mk II project. This experimental canard has a 133.2 TTAF. The original Subaru EA-71 engine was replaced by the builder with a Subaru EA-81 engine at 20.1 hours. The Subaru EA-81 has a Dave Johnson 1.64:1 propeller speed reduction unit with a total of 113.1 hours on it. The propeller that is currently used is a ground adjustable, HPRPM warp drive prop (SER.No.R2800) which has 113.1 hours on it. There are no electrical systems or radios installed. The airplane was last inspected on January 2, 1998 by the builder. The work that needs to be done includes elevators that need to be repaired or replaced and the cooling system which needs to be upgraded and engine tested. This could be a great candidate for electric propulsion. More pictures and questions are quickly available upon request. This aircraft currently has the canard and wings removed for ease of storage. 
