#### Greg Stopyra:

As you look towards our 2024 Young Eagle campaign, could you please provide feedback as to how you see things shaping up in terms of schedule, resources, and volunteer support?

We have a Chapter Business Meeting on 8 May and I'd like to address a couple of my significant concerns that impact our chapter. One concern I have is based on participating and observing our Young Eagles program over the past 3 years. My observation is that our biggest challenge for YE Rallys is getting consistent support from our volunteer pilots...with a small core of regulars and then occasional pilots (and ground volunteers) that seem to support for only a year or two.

There can be a number of factors causing that...and I'm not sure if there is a single root cause. I'm just concerned that our collective desire to fly young eagles is ultimately limited by our ability to recruit YE Pilots. If true, I would like to share this concern with the board to see if there is an ability for us to better support your efforts.

#### **Bob Thomas:**

Yes you are right, pilots is an issue. Not sure how to fix that. We used to get more like 7-9 planes per event and now it is more like 3-5 with Bob and I being 2 of those. Part of it is demographics. Some of our more reliable pilots have gotten too old to fly Young Eagles and some have retired permanently to the south. Every time we have a rally there is a story to tell, I need to be supplying Adam with more of those stories for the newsletter as that might encourage more folks to attend and Bob and I could be more into the recruiting idea during Saturday morning coffee time.

We would like to have Young Eagles Coordinators place a write up in our meeting minutes asking for volunteer pilots and also publish the summer calendar of Young Eagles flights. PNB would also like to have a YE event for the build students after school on a normal build day.

#### 2. Chapter Focus Areas (Programs & Events) - Chapter Strategy Discussion

Less of the general public is getting involved in aviation. Even less of that population is focused on aircraft building. Much of EAA Chapter 75's 64 year history was built upon a solid foundation of pilot / builders to support our various programs. Our current chapter spans 4 generations of memberships. The distribution of members within those generations is not equal...we are very top heavy. As such, we must be more actively aware of how this affects our programs to ensure we can continue to succeed in areas most important to the chapter.
