In February of 2024, PNB Aviation's opportunity to visit Eaton was one I didn't regret signing up for. My classmates and the mentors made our way into Eaton for the first time not knowing what to expect. Well, all of us except Ryan Story, who joined us as he is employed by Eaton! We had many questions on our

minds. Was Eaton making huge planes we'd never heard of? Or perhaps something else?

With high expectations, we began our trip with a quick lay-down of safety in the workplace before heading to our first destination. We started by touring around a production area, where fuel tanks were being built. Our guide explained to us that these tanks were used for airborne refueling, a process I heard about for the first time. There were many machines with yellow hazard tape and signs, and many workers moving machines I didn't know existed. He also mentioned that they sometimes got older plane models for repairs, unfortunately there weren't any at the time. Soon later we were met by an engineer who showed us the inventions Eaton produced. Most inventions were related to pilot safety and were essential to successful flights. One item we saw was a wateractivated release. He explained to us how they were designed to free pilots from their parachutes when hitting seawater so they wouldn't be dragged down. There were also cryogenic coolers powered by helium and designed to cool down the infrared goggles pilots wore. When I asked the engineer if there was any substitute for helium, he said something along the lines of "If we couldn't use helium anymore, it would be a really bad day for the engineers."

For our last round around Eaton, we got to see some oxygen masks used by jet pilots, and we finished off by getting a peek at a basket-like drogue used for mid-flight refueling. It was interesting as we watched the basket fold into a small pack like origami, and then out once more. When we were done with the tour, we got to meet with the many engineers in a staff room

where they gave us an overview of what they work on here. We got to ask questions about the engineer's work, and their experience.

Overall, it seemed that Eaton had confidence in the future of aviation. What felt like an entirely different world in Eaton's building soon disappeared from our Van's sight as the tour ended, but I definitely would not forget the experience I gained that day.

Gone West: Aerospace Legend & Retired United States Air Force Lt. Col. Richard "Dick" Rutan

We are sadden to share the passing of our dear friend and aerospace legend, Richard "Dick" Rutan, on May 3, 2024, at the age of 85. Dick passed in the early evening at the Kootenai Hospital in Coeur di' Alene, Idaho surrounded by Kris Rutan, his wife of 25 years, friends, and family. Dick was an Air Force officer and Vietnam War fighter pilot who flew 325 missions in Vietnam. After Vietnam, he became a test pilot and later served as Commander of the 355th Field Maintenance Squadron. Dick was awarded the Silver Star, five Distinguished Flying Crosses, 16 Air Medals, and a Purple Heart. He participated with his brother, Elbert "Burt" Rutan, at numerous EAA AirVenture Oshkosh events. During EAA AirVenture 1984, he brought the Rutan Model 76 Voyager (N269VA) aircraft, the first airplane to fly around the world without stopping or replenishing fuel. Piloted

by Dick Rutan and Jeana Yeager, the around the world flight of 26,366 statue miles lasted 9 days, 3 minutes, and 44 seconds. This unique aircraft is currently preserved at the National Air & Space Museum in Washington, DC.

EAA CEO/Chairman Jack Pelton: "Dick Rutan is closely linked with EAA history for the past half-century. Whether it was the flights of canard aircraft to Oshkosh back in the 1970s, the unforgettable Voyager project and mission in the 1980s, or his regular trips to AirVenture for forum presentations almost every year, Dick Rutan was a true friend of EAA and AirVenture. We will miss him and remember him, and our condolences go to his family at this time."

At EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2021, Dick Rutan participated in a Warbirds in Review discussion.

At EAA AirVenture 2017, Dick Rutan participated in a <u>Warbirds in Review</u> discussion where he talked about his military career, Lockheed T-33 Shooting Star, Northrop F-89 Scorpion, among other things.

At EAA AirVenture Oshkosh, Dick Rutan talked at a <u>Warbirds in Review</u> discussion. The program was centered around the Voyager flight and his book.

Rest in peace to an aviation legend, American hero, retired United States Air Force Brig. Gen. & World War II Triple Ace Clarence 'Bud' Anderson. Bud died in his sleep on May 17, 2024, aged 102, at his home in Auburn, California. He served with the 357th Fighter Group "Yoxford Boys," 8th Air Force, Leiston Field,

based in the United Kingdom during World War II and totaled 16¼ air victories. His military career also extended into Korea and Vietnam. After his military career, he became Manager of McDonnell Aircraft Company's Flight Test Facility at Edwards Air Force Base.

He was an outstanding ambassador for preserving and sharing history. A WWII P-51 Mustang triple ace, he flew over 100 types of aircraft, logged over 7,500 flight hours, & served in the military for a long period of time. On December 2, 2022, he was promoted from Colonel to the honorary rank of Brigadier General by General Charles Q. Brown Jr., the Air Force Chief of Staff.

On Tuesday, July 23, 2024, the 1 PM Warbirds in Review presentation at EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2024 will be a celebration of life for Brig. Gen. Anderson. His friends reach far and wide and run deep in the warbird and military communities. Bud was the only individual featured as a speaker every year since the inception of Warbirds in Review more than 20 years ago. All are invited to this Warbirds in Review program for a celebration of a life well lived.

During this difficult time, our thoughts and prayers are with his friends and family. He will be missed by

As part of the Thursday, July 25, 2019, air show, Horsemoney and AirShowStuff produced separate videos that captured the large gathering of North American P-51 Mustangs.

Bud Anderson spoke at the Warbirds in Review discussion at EAA AirVenture Oshkosh, where he was the star of the discussion every year.






