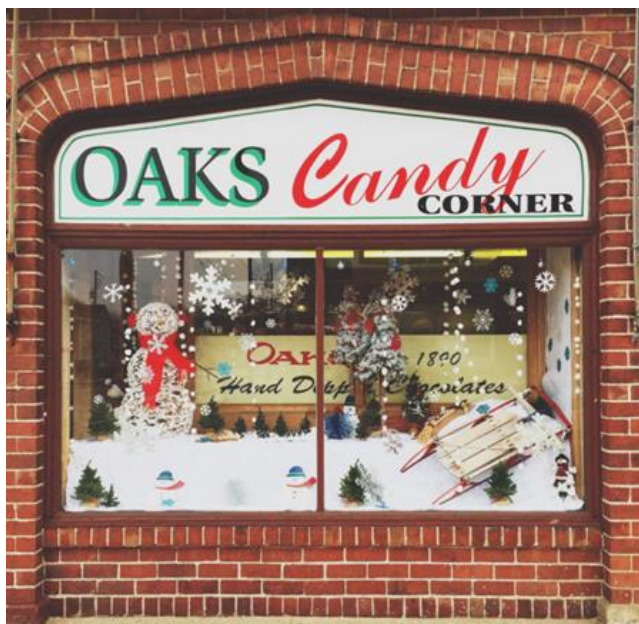

EAA Webinar - The End of Supervised Maintenance?

On September 3rd, 2024, the FAA's Rulemaking Law Division issued a legal interpretation that, if allowed to stand as the agency's position, could have a devastating impact on the ability of aircraft owners and apprentice mechanics to perform maintenance on certificated aircraft under the supervision of an A&P

mechanic. Known as the "[Moss Interpretation](#)," it would eviscerate the requirement of 14 CFR 43.3(d) that the supervising mechanic "personally observe the work to the extent necessary to ensure it is done properly," and would instead require in-person supervision of every moment of the work from start to finish. In this webinar, Mike Busch A&P/IA explains why this new interpretation would make owner-performed maintenance (including owner-assisted annuals) infeasible, and would make it impossible for aspiring A&Ps to gain the FAA-mandated 30 months of practical experience through apprenticeship. This webinar qualifies for FAA WINGS/AMT credit.

Congratulations to chapter member Jim Fowler on the completion of his homebuilt 2023 Belite Chipper (N6363) & its successful first flight. He began building the project in August 2018 and completed it in October 2024. It took him six years to complete the project. He flew N6363 for the first time on Nov. 26th, 2024 at 2:44 PM at Gen-Air Airpark Airport (3G8) in Geneseo, Illinois. This aircraft is powered by an Aero Momentum AM13H water-cooled fuel-injected 100HP engine behind a Luga Three-Bladed 67" Composite Propeller. The panel consists of a Trig Transponder with ADS-B & a Talos Pro Glass Panel. He is eager to visit as many places as possible and the amount he has learned along the way is priceless.

Maj. Sam "RaZZ" Larson's Incredible Two Years as An F-22 Raptor Demo Pilot

Congratulations to Commander & Pilot Major Samuel "RaZZ" Larson on his final performance with the United States Air Force F-22 Raptor Demo Team at the 2024 edition of the Stuart Air Show. RaZZ is a 2011 Bettendorf High School graduate and a Davenport, Iowa native. Adam Santic also graduated from Bettendorf High School, but in 2013.

As a young boy at the fence looking up, RaZZ was introduced to fighter pilots during air shows. Sam enjoyed attending air shows in the Midwest and at the Quad City Air Show in Davenport, IA during the summer while the other children were playing sports. Throughout his life, RaZZ had dreamed of becoming a fighter pilot. It was a dream that, like most worthy dreams, was paved with obstacles and hurdles, but despite each obstacle, he was able to overcome it.

After high school, Maj. Larson attended the United States Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, CO. In 2015, Maj. Larson earned his commission and

graduated from the United States Air Force Academy with a Bachelor of Science degree in management science. Maj. Larson then attended undergraduate pilot training at Sheppard Air Force Base, Texas, where he flew the Beechcraft T-6 Texan II and the Northrop T-38C Talon. After earning his pilot wings he was selected to fly the Lockheed Martin F-22 Raptor after completing the program in 2017.

Following pilot training and Introduction to Fighter Fundamentals, Maj. Larson attended the F-22 Raptor Basic Course at Tyndall AFB, Florida. Upon graduation, Maj. Larson was assigned to the 525th Fighter Squadron (FS) at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska as an operational fighter pilot and Mission Commander.

Maj. Larson was then assigned to the 27th Fighter Squadron, Joint Base Langley-Eustis, Virginia as an F-22 Instructor Pilot. While serving in the 27th FS, Maj. Larson was selected to be the F-22 Raptor Demonstration Team commander and pilot in August of 2022, a role he served until November of 2024.

Watching him perform at air shows these past two years has been an honor and a pleasure. You're our hometown hero, and it's an honor to see you protect and serve our great country. One of my greatest joys is getting to spend time with the greatest men and women of our military. You have impacted me in ways that I cannot even describe. Thank you for protecting and serving our great nation and showing the capabilities of the most feared aircraft in the world today, your United States Air Force F-22 Raptor. It has been the absolute best two years to be able to spend time with this team. A family bond that can be felt from miles away. I am extremely proud of each and every one of you!

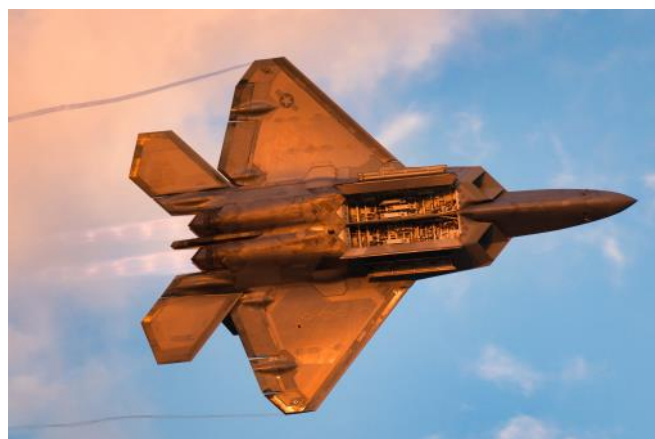

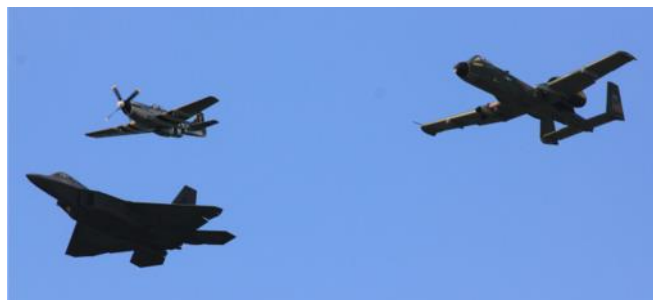

Jane Berg Tailwheel Scholarship

This scholarship is for tailwheel training in Milan, Illinois at the KMLI airport. The training will be completed in a 100HP 1946 Piper J3 Cub in accordance with 14 CFR §61.31(i). It will consist of approximately five to six hours of flight training and will conclude with a tailwheel endorsement.

This scholarship has a combined value of \$2,000. Of that amount, \$800 will be granted for the flight training. The remaining amount will be used for transportation to the training airport, housing, food, etc. That amount will be reimbursed upon completion of the training. If the applicant selected is determined to be based locally*, the amount for expenses will be held for the following year's scholarship. Applicants will have one year to complete the training or the funds for the flight portion will be forfeited.

**"local" applicants are defined by their current address residing within a 100 mile radius of KMLI, Quad City International Airport*

Scholarship applicants must meet all the following criteria:

- U.S. citizen or U.S. permanent resident
- Female
- Hold a minimum of an FAA Private Pilot or Sport Pilot certification in airplane
- Must hold a current flight review or equivalent under 14 CFR §61.56
- Meet parameters for the airplane (Piper Cub) to be flown within legal limitations

Background

This scholarship was setup and established to honor those that promote progress in aviation. Jane Berg was one of the many of my flight instructors and supervisors I've had over the years. She has the patience and a way of communicating that any teacher would envy. The time she invested in me, helped me to achieve my aviation goals and end up where I am today. My hope is that this scholarship honors her professionalism and transfers hands on flying skills to the applicant selected.

Craig Blumer

Craig trained as a professional pilot in southeast Iowa and worked as a flight instructor across the United States. He acquired various certifications including seaplane, powered parachute, glider, airline transport pilot, commercial lighter-than-air airship and terminal air traffic controller. His flight instruction has earned him a gold seal flight instructor certificate and master instructor designations. Craig obtained his tail wheel endorsement in 2013 and planned to own and operate a flight school. The Cub became the platform for offering tail wheel instruction in 2020.

My name is Jane Walter Berg and I have been flying since 1984. Since that time my main focus has been on flight instruction. I have always enjoyed teaching people to fly and help make their dreams come true. During that time, I have flown with hundreds of students and developed close friendships with many of them, such as Craig Blumer. The EAA Ray Aviation Scholarship is a scholarship program that is funded by the Ray Foundation, managed by EAA, and administered through EAA Chapter 75. The Ray Scholarship provides **up to \$12,000** to support a student's private pilot license training. If selected, the Ray Scholarship funding will process from the chapter treasurer to the Student's flight instructor/school. The student/guardians do not receive direct funding. If an applicant has already begun flight training, award money cannot be used to retroactively pay for prior training.

Applications will be accepted through February 14, 2025

Eligibility Requirements for the Ray Aviation Scholarship:

These are EAA's minimum requirements and are not waivable

1. Must be Age 16-19 for powered flight training.
2. Must possess an FAA Medical Certificate
3. Must possess an FAA Student Pilot Certificate
4. Must begin flight training within 60 days of accepting the award
5. Must be able to volunteer for Chapter service a minimum of 2 hours per month
6. Must meet with the Chapter Coordinator and submit a Monthly Activity Report which details flight training, volunteer activities, and costs
7. Must be able to schedule at least 3 flight lessons per week
8. Must be able to solo within 3 months of start
9. Must be able to pass the FAA Knowledge Test within 6 months
10. Must be able to take and pass the FAA Checkride within 12 months

Application Evaluation:

EAA Chapter 75's Ray Aviation Scholarship Committee will evaluate students who meet the above minimum requirements to determine the best candidate for the scholarship. The evaluation factors will include

- Application & Essay
- Involvement with EAA Chapter 75 Events
- Participation in Young Eagles Flights
- Completion of the Young Eagles Flight Plan
- Additionally, EAA Chapter 75 will ask that parents become members of both EAA Chapter 75 and EAA National Organizations.
