President's Corner



We are already in the month of June and I hope you are making detailed plans for this year's AirVenture in Oshkosh, Wisconsin, taking place from July 21st through the 27th.

Have you heard? On May 23rd, the PNB Aviation Club's 2025 Van's RV-12iS (N525PN), finished its five hours of required flight time. This little airplane will not be around for long, so if you have not seen it yet, you might want to. I am pleased to say that several parties are interested in buying it from the school as soon as it becomes available. Please review the project update provided by Tom Shelton on page 11.

SUN 'n FUN Aerospace Expo - Part 1:

In April, I flew as pilot-in-command in a 1973 Cessna 172M Skyhawk (N147J) for 19.6 hours roundtrip to the SUN 'N FUN Aerospace Expo in Lakeland, Florida. I intend to write a two-part column about my experiences traveling with my friends. The following is part one.

On Friday, March 3, Jim White and I took off in a Skyhawk from Quad Cities International Airport

(MLI/KMLI) with the intention of arriving at the Southwest Georgia Regional Airport (ABY/KABY) in Albany, Georgia the same day. Craig Olson and Mark Howell, who were piloting Craig's 1959 Cessna 180B Skywagon (N880CK) to Albany, would meet us there.

I filed Instrument Flight Rules (IFR) at 7,000 ft. because of the weather, which included high clouds, and moderate to strong headwinds. With a fuel capacity of three and a half hours, N147J has short legs. So, we would need to make two fuel stops before arriving in Albany. We filled up at the self-service tank during our first 2.5-hour leg from KMLI to Harrisburg-Raleigh Airport (HSB/KHSB). The flight took about three hours since, as usual, the headwinds were greater than expected. Harrisburg to Isbell Field (4A9), IFR at 9,000 ft. was the destination of our subsequent leg. Once more, headwinds caused our two-hour, twenty-minute flight to take longer. A very long day came to an end with the final leg from 4A9 to Albany, Georgia. All of these flights were filed as IFR flights.

On the leg to Albany, the sun had already set, and I was glad to utilize the RNAV approach to locate the airport among all the city lights. After turning on the runway lights at the final approach fix and with a closed tower, I could see that we were lined up for the runway. We were now both looking forward to having supper with Craig and Mark.

Murphy's Law then came into play when the airport lights went out on short final. Despite numerous tries to raise the lights to any level, they would not turn on. Fortunately, N147J has two LED wingtip lights and an LED landing light that illuminated the runway. This made an unexpected landing without runway lighting safe. The runway and taxi lights did turn on once we were on the ground and nearly at the FBO, but we were still perplexed.

The next day, we packed things & left for Zephyrhills Municipal Airport (ZPH/KZPH). We contacted the Albany Tower and informed them of our runway lighting incident. They told us that they had a 15-minute delay before the lights would come back on, which seemed to fit our experience but left us both perplexed by the logic behind that.

Once again, I filed an IFR plan at 7,000 ft. We anticipated a two-hour trip, but to our surprise, the tailwind was greater than anticipated.

Landing at Zephyrhills Municipal Airport was complicated by the number of training aircraft in the area and the limited use of the radio by others in the pattern. Mark Howell commented that "it was quite a circus". With the planes tied down for the next week, we picked up the rental car and started our 2025 SUN 'n FUN adventure. Here are a few pictures at the show:

Here I am standing in front of a 1943 Grumman FM-2 Wildcat (N29FG), which has particular significance for me because it was one of the aircraft that my close friend Herb Wood flew during World War II.



I spent a lot of time flying with Herb in a 1966 Mooney M20E (N9215M). According to Herb, throughout the war, the F4F shot down more Japanese Zeros than any other Navy aircraft. Given that he took part in the Great Marianas Turkey Shoot during the Battle of the Philippine Sea, Herb should know. Many of our Quad City Aviators miss Herb Wood. He was a terrific friend.

The return trip included a tour of the Beechcraft Heritage Museum at Tullahoma Regional Airport (THA/KTHA), also known as William Northern Field. This will be covered in Part 2 of my story in a future edition. The museum is among the best museums I have ever been to. It boasts a fantastic historical collection of Beechcraft airplanes and is housed in two beautiful buildings. Here are some images to entice you until next month:

Beechcraft manufacturing facility in Wichita, Kansas. It remains as evidence of the corporate culture that Olive Ann Beech, the quality control manager for Beechcraft, ingrained in the company's culture.



The first staggered-wing Beechcraft, Model 17R, Type Certificate: 496, which was awarded on December 20, 1932, is depicted in the image to the left. Tail number NC499N is a significant illustration of Beechcraft's early tech-

nology, which was created in response to the demand for a load lifting, long-range aircraft. NC499N traveled at a dizzying 60 miles per hour.

The first thing I would like to say is thank you to all the wonderful chapter members of EAA Chapter 75 and my family who have helped me along the way with this incredible build of my 2024 Van's RV-10 (N823CW). There is no way I would be where I am today without the support and encouragement of everyone who helped me by picking up a tool and lending me a hand or just guiding me in the right direction.

My family and I purchased the partially completed kit in upper state New York on Black Friday 2020 as our Black Friday 2020 purchase. From the beginning until my plane was offloaded via a Penske truck in Eldridge, Iowa, the chapter has made sure I was taken care of.



I started out with a full inventory and a few months of inspecting the previous builders work and service bulletins. I then began building.

After that, I began working on the wings. As they were coming along nicely, I underestimated the time it would take to complete the remainder of the pro-

ject. I ordered the Lycoming engine, and then started designing the avionics with SteinAir. Then, after the wings were built, we continued to run and install wires throughout the aircraft. The engine install took a lot more time and learning than I would have hoped.

With a mounted engine came the cowling fit problems and also the introduction to fiberglass work. If you think parenting teaches patience, try fiberglass work! Next, I installed the wiring harness and connected all the engine monitors. By then, the panel was also in place.

Of all milestones in the build process, powering up



the avionics and watching it come alive is really exciting! The engine and the attachment of the wings were next. The expression 90% done with 90% to go is accurate. Summer of 2024, I was able to

refocus and motivate myself with the excitement of the first engine start! These steps included weight and balance, prop balancing, and final calibration of the flight controls.

Finally, on Monday, March 24th, 2025, Designated Airworthiness Representative (DAR) Ross Carbiener with the Greater Chicago Flight Standards District Office (FSDO) granted N823CW its airworthiness certificate, and on May 6th, 2025, I took N823CW up for its first flight at the Davenport Municipal Airport (DVN/KDVN).




First Flight.

 - One solo cross country flight of at least 150 nautical miles total distance with landings at 3 different points. One leg must be at least 50 nautical miles straight line distance
 - 3 takeoffs and landings at an airport with an operating control tower

PASS A 60-QUESTION WRITTEN KNOWLEDGE TEST WITH A SCORE OF 70% OR HIGHER



PASS THE TWO-PART PRACTICAL TEST INCLUDING AN ORAL EXAM WITH AN FAA EXAMINER, FOLLOWED BY THE FLIGHT PORTION OF THE TEST.



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
