Old Business / Open Issues

FAA FAASTeam – Aviation Safety

Avoiding Adverse Drug Interactions

Impairment from medication, particularly the over the counter (OTC) medication, is cited as a factor in many general aviation accidents. A 2011 study by the <u>FAA Civil Aerospace Medical Institute's</u> Toxicology Lab found that drugs/medications were found in 570 fatal accident pilots (42 percent of 1,353 autopsies). Ninety percent of those pilots were flying under <u>14 CFR Part 91</u>. It's important for pilots also to consider possible adverse reactions when taking more than one drug. 
