Neil Hansen to Speak at Aviation Heritage Center

Neil Hansen began his aviation career as a pilot for the now disappeared Teamster boss [Jimmy Hoffa](#).

When it seemed Hoffa would be heading for federal prison, Hansen knew he would soon be out of a job. He found a new calling with a company called [Air America](#).

Hansen, in 1964, soon found himself based in Southeast Asia with a company covertly operated by the [Central Intelligence Agency](#).

The 11 years that followed in Saigon and Laos turned out to be stranger than fiction. As a captain for Air America, Hansen accumulated more than 29,000 hours of flight time, 9,000 hours in a combat zone. He flew the last plane out of Cambodia hours before the murderous [Khmer Rouge](#) closed the airport.

So, how did Hansen connect with the [Aviation Heritage Center](#) in Sheboygan? Now living in Oshkosh, Hansen stopped in at the Aviation Heritage Center at the [Sheboygan County Memorial Airport](#) and Dave Rudd, one of the museum directors, found himself fascinated by Hansen's story as well as the history of Air America.

In particular, it was the connection between Air America in Laos and the Hmong that prompted Rudd to create an exhibit around Air America, using Hansen's artifacts and story to illustrate the display.

[Vietnam War](#) veterans will recall that Air America was frequently their transportation in country as well as often their search-and-rescue pick-ups. The Hmong community will also never forget the Air America pilots who evacuated them to safety in the face of the approaching communist forces of the [Pathet Lao](#). Air America crews and the Hmong pilots of the T-28s were brothers-in-arms in Laos.

Second Funding Opportunity for Aviation Workforce Grant Programs

The FAA is seeking applications for two [Aviation Workforce Development Grant](#) programs aimed at developing and inspiring a more diverse pool of pilots and aviation maintenance technicians to join the next generation of aviation professionals. This is the FAA's second funding opportunity for these programs. A total of \$10 million is available for the grants.

The [Aircraft Pilots Workforce Development Grants](#) will educate students to become pilots, aerospace engineers, or unmanned aircraft systems operators. The [Aviation Maintenance Technical Workers Workforce Development Grants](#) will prepare aviation maintenance technicians.
