Take Action on Critical Flight Training Issue

Earlier this year, a federal court determined that compensated flight instruction in experimental, limited, and primary category aircraft, even instruction obtained in an individual's own aircraft, was contrary to FAA regulation. While the FAA has used letters of deviation authority (LODAs) and exemptions to temporarily address the issue, a long-term fix is years away under the normal rulemaking process.

This is unacceptable to EAA and the rest of the general aviation community. That is why we are backing the Certainty for General Aviation Pilots Act to quickly address the issue. With the help of EAA, twin bills have been introduced in the Senate and House that would require the FAA to recognize flight training and the Additional Pilot Program for homebuilt flight testing as permitted activities not requiring any special authorization. The Senate bill is S.2458, introduced by Senators James Inhofe (R-OK), John Boozman (R-AR), and Angus King (I-ME), and the House bill is H.R.4645, introduced by Representative Sam Graves (R-MO).

Contact your members of Congress today and ask them to cosponsor the Certainty for General Aviation Pilots Act. While personal phone calls, emails, or letters are the most impactful ways to make your voice heard, EAA has set up a convenient way to send a note of support to your congressional delegation.

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History Uncovered: Tasche Plane Crash

Two county residents were missing somewhere in the Canadian wilderness. Dr. John Tasche, of Sheboygan, and Niles Eichenberger, of Plymouth, both experienced pilots, were headed to Stony Rapids in remote northern Saskatchewan for a few days of fly fishing. Stony Rapids is just 50 miles south of the border with the Northwest Territories. (August 9, 1951)

The two men left Sheboygan on July 29 for a two-week trip. Their plane was equipped with plenty of food along with survival equipment, but prior to leaving Dr. Tasche had left instructions with Saskatchewan government officials, "I'm leaving with a full load of gas for Stony Rapids and then back to Black Lake and possibly Cree Lake and will wire you on arrival at Stony Rapids. If you receive no word from me in three days, start a search." With no communication from Tasche after a week the RCAF (Royal Canadian Air Force) commenced "Operation Tasche," methodically searching the doctor's flight path covering more than 30,000 miles in the first few days.

On August 14th Curt Joa of Sheboygan Falls, Dr. Leslie Tasche, John's cousin and Ruth Joa, left Carm Airfield outside of Plymouth to aid in the search. Both Joa and his daughter were pilots. Joa thought Tasche's plane may have been pushed off course by strong headwinds and run out of fuel. They also planned to hire bush planes to aid in the search. After scouring more than 90,000 miles of wilderness over 11 days and spending more than \$20,000 on fuel, a scarce commodity in the far north, the RCAF search was abandoned.

But, folks at home never gave up. Local citizens rallied to get the attention of Gov. Walter J. Kohler Jr. who managed to restart the search. On Aug. 29, two U.S. Air Force B-17 bombers and two Catalina flying boats joined the search, and after just two days a newspaper headline announced, "Find Two Missing Men, Tasche and Eichenberger, Safe and Sound." The men were sighted by the U.S. Air Force shortly after noon on Aug. 31 on Snowbird Lake in an unmapped part of the Northwest Territories, 128 miles northeast of their original destination.

Missing for 29 long and difficult days, both men were bearded, mosquitobitten and much thinner.

When asked about the cause of their debacle, Tasche noted their compass spun crazily and ceased to work causing them to wander too far north, past the tree line where they landed on a small unnamed lake. By then their fuel was nearly spent. Click here for the entire story as published in the Sun.
