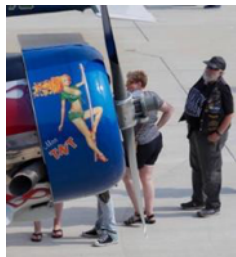

Meeting Notes of June 19, 2023

Wings and Wheels 2023 occurred Sunday June 18th. At the end of the Clean-up / Tear-Down activity on Monday June 19th, a short meeting was called to address a proposal from Lee Kunze. The AHC ice machine is broken and in need of replacement. The proposal was to ask that the EAA Chapter 766 consider making a donation of up to \$2500 in order to purchase a new ice machine. Timing of this decision hinges on the upcoming July T-28 Clinic where the chapter makes heavy use of the machine. Glenn Valenstein and Lee Kunze will inquire about options for a direct donation of a machine from prior supporters. If no direct donation appears likely prior to the T-28 Clinic, then the back-up plan of purchasing a new one will be executed. By majority of the chapter members present, the proposal to allow expenditure of up to \$2500.00 from EAA chapter funds for purchase of a new ice machine was approved.
