Guest Speaker Brian Liddle - Artist

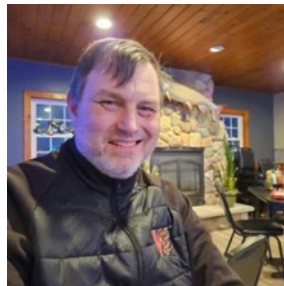

Due to financial hardships from lack of enrollment and the pandemic, the school closed down. He is currently an art major at the University of Wisconsin Green Bay.

Brian is currently working on a project in which the goal was to draw 50 or more aircraft and display them at public museums and galleries throughout the area (i.e. EAA Museum, Neville Public. Green Bay, WI.) His project is a work in progress.

Brian mainly does colored pencil drawings and is able to draw and paint any subject matter. His passion is for aviation. The line drawings are currently for an unfinished project. They are his own drawings and will be using them as “tracers to produce his final project; to produce drawings for the public to purchase or enjoy.

Brian is a member of Warbirds Squadron 32 out of Oshkosh, WI and a lifetime member of the Commemorative Air Force Wisconsin Wing out of Waukesha, WI. The organizations have allowed him and inspired him to draw and display his art at various events. He is motivated me to travel throughout the state and meet people.

He gives drawings as gifts to the Veterans who flew historical missions and to relive their experiences in their historical, iconic aircraft. In his trade as a person caregiver for Home Instead LLC, he feels he is bringing the aging Veterans joy and comfort, as he does on his job.

Notable People of EAA

Paul Poberezny (Founder) came from humble beginnings, yet he created one of the world largest aviation organizations and emerged as one of the 20th century's greatest aviation leaders, creating a worldwide aviation organization and the world's largest annual fly-in event, EAA AirVenture in Oshkosh, Wisconsin.

Tom Poberezny (1946-2022) was first elected president of EAA in 1989, succeeding his father, EAA founder Paul Poberezny. He assumed additional duties as EAA's Chairman of the Board in February 2009, then retired as chairman of EAA and EAA AirVenture in August 2011. An accomplished aviator in his own right, Tom was a member of the U.S. National Unlimited Aerobatic Team that captured the World Championship in 1972.

Jack Pelton was named as **EAA's Chief Executive Officer** in November 2015, formally adding those responsibilities to the Chairman of the Board role to which he was first elected in October 2012. [EAA website](#)
