Airplane Maintenance Services at Sheboygan County Memorial Airport

Airworthy Aviation was purchased by Tony and Heather Piechowski of Cascade, WI on October 1, 2023. Tony heard the original owners were retiring after many years of service at Sheboygan airport and there would be no aircraft maintenance facility at the Sheboygan County Airport to service airplanes. Tony and Heather decided to purchase the business and 'keep the doors open and the lights on' for airplane servicing locally. Tony and Heather are thrilled to offer a quality service for the Sheboygan and surrounding aviation community. Tony's wide background in mechanical engineering and design, Offroad industry, racecars, technology, volunteer firefighting, and aviation has been the motivation to keep the doors open at Airworthy Aviation. Tony grew up in aviation with a father as a pilot. Tony is also a pilot himself and a member of the Sheboygan Flying Club.

"Airworthy Aviation is a family-owned business here to serve the Sheboygan area and beyond" Tony said. The chief mechanic, Bill Surran, mentioned "we service airplanes not only from the Sheboygan area but also statewide". Airplane servicing periodically occurs for transient aircraft when special events like Road America Races and Whistling Straits Golf occurs. Airworthy Aviation operates under part 91 with certified Airframe and power plant certificates including Inspection Authorization. Services available include annual inspections, routine maintenance, aircraft repairs/upgrades, expert technical support, 24/7 emergency services, and pre-buy inspections. "There is enough room for three planes to receive servicing indoors at the same time. We try to keep at least one spot open or available for same day service when possible." Tony noted.

The Midwest Military Vehicle Association (MMVA), a local affiliate of the International Military Vehicle Preservation Association-Historical Archives (MVPA-HA) is pleased to announce that we will host our 49th Annual International Convention in Oshkosh in September 2024. This military vehicle show, vintage warbird fly-in, vendor trade show and seminar will be held at the Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA) grounds in Oshkosh. Public dates for the show are September 12th to the 14th.

The MVPA-HA, a 501(c)3, is comprised of nearly 4,000 members in 83 affiliate chapters worldwide and provides an organization for military vehicle enthusiasts, historians, preservationists, and collectors interested in the acquisition, restoration, preservation, safe operation, public education, and display of historic military transportation. Our members maintain "history in motion" with a wide assortment of vehicles from horse drawn wagons, bicycles, scooters, motorcycles, jeeps and light vehicles to heavy trucks, trailers, and tracked armored vehicles. These veteran vehicles support local parades, veteran organization events, school programs, public displays, and many members of the MVPA and the MMVA are also in Commemorative Air Force Wings and the EAA Warbird Chapters. Our goal in bringing this convention to Wisconsin is, first and foremost, to honor the armed forces service members who risked their lives to ensure our freedoms. Another goal is to inform and inspire the next generation of vehicle enthusiasts to get involved in the purchase, restoration, maintenance, and operation of historic military vehicles. By beginning the planning for this event over a year out we hope to get over 1,000 attendees per day to our three-day show.

Specifically, we now seek vintage warbirds to fly-in to Oshkosh and be on display 12-14 September. Our goal is to fill up Celebration Way in front of Hangars A and Hangar C with trainers, observation aircraft, fighters, transports, liaison, and bombers for the public to see. We are researching whether Wittman Field will allow us to offer the rides program in conjunction with the show as a fundraising event for CAF Wings and EAA Warbird Chapters. We are also looking for volunteers to help manage the airfield and the tarmac during the times aircraft are flying-in, on display, and returning home. If you are interested in volunteering, please let me know.

We look forward to bringing this event to the Wisconsin in 2024 and hope the EAA Warbirds will have a strong showing.
