# **EAA Chapter 766 Meeting/Tour**

Monday 04/18/2022

Approximately 15 members of EAA Chapter 766 joined at the GA Terminal building next door to AHC for a tour of the Customs office. Officer Kyle Ott explained his current role, history with the organization and the special uses and requirements of the building. We thanked Officer Ott for his time and appreciated the opportunity.

## **The U.S. Customs Facility Sheboygan County Memorial Airport**

The project was started in the fall of 2019 as a partnership between the county, Kohler Company and the Wisconsin Bureau of Aeronautics. According to a news release, both corporate and general aviation will be able to fly directly from abroad to Sheboygan County.

"The presence of a local CBP (Customs and Border Patrol) office will enhance the attractiveness of international business growth and tourism for the entire area," said John Kelchen, director of aviation for Kohler Co.

A Customs office was just one part of the \$5 million project. The new facility will also be home to the airport's new general aviation terminal and administration offices.

Foreign and domestic pilots and passengers will be able to use the facility for pit stops, weather checks and a place to meet with family and friends.

The Sheboygan County Memorial Airport adds \$25.9 million in economic output for the community, the news release said, and businesses based there, like fueling, aircraft storage and maintenance, support 76 jobs in the community.

It has two runways over 5,000 feet long and can handle an aircraft as large as a regional jet, the release said.

The Customs and General Aviation Terminal is located at N6193 Resource Drive, in Sheboygan Falls. The General Aviation side of the building is open to the public 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. Sheboygan Press


