

#### **DREAM WITH EYES OPEN** – Tanmoy's PPL Journey

About 1 hour to sunset, we were flying over a meandering river on a Piper Cub, trying to keep up with the rushing water beneath us. Took a hard bank to the right and buzzed over a thick line of trees merely at 500 ft AGL. My co-pilot David Beckham looked back at me and grinned, "full power?" I pushed the throttle and pulled up, soaring into the sky and both of us kept giggling like school kids. "We're flying, bloody hell!!!"

Okay, by now you guys figured this isn't real, but you know the feeling! This was the dream I had when I was in my 20s. Just settling into my software engineering job, wondering what life has in store. I always had great fascination for airplanes – especially air crash investigations. But never really thought that flying could be a thing. Then this dream!!! My only thought was, "If flying feels even half as good as this, I have to learn how to do this!"

Fast forward about 7 years later – 26th Feb 2022, I walked up to N56591 – a Piper Cherokee 140 at Aviation Center, Ann Arbor. I had already passed my medical and written test by then, but I had still not tasted flight. The rickety old Cherokee taxied onto Runway 24 and we went full power. My first impression was "that's it? That's full power?" It was hard to believe how easily our small planes can fly. But after takeoff I, realized what that dream meant to me. Flying doesn't feel half as good, it feels ten times more rewarding. That was my "Welcome to the Sky" moment.

I finally joined Michigan Flyers at Ann Arbor and started my flight training on the mighty Cessna 152. The first few hours surprised me a lot. As an engineer, for all these years I thought I was using my brain a lot. But those first 5 hours of flight training totally humbled me. The task saturation when you're learning so many things is unreal. There were days when I would drive back home from the airport and just sleep, and next morning I had no recollection of the drive back. Well, that was a bit exaggerated, but you get the drift. All the hard work finally paid off on my First Solo day. Usually, everyone would have a lot to tell, but for me it was a small win, and I was already looking forward to the actual fun part – "Cross Country". Ohh, I also had this bet going on to not watch Topgun till I solo. The week I did my solo, they stopped showing Topgun on IMAX.

Didn't matter though, I was my own Maverick at this point. On the first solo XC I went to Coldwater (KOEB). Then the long XC to Alma (KAMN) and Battle Creek (KBTL). I used Flight Following for both trips and I probably overworked myself trying to make sure everything was in the green. On my last leg back to Ann Arbor (KARB), I realized I need about 10 extra minutes to get to my 5-hour solo XC. The setting sun was right behind me, and the horizon started turning orange. I pulled the throttle back to economy cruise and soared through the sky at 85 knots. This was the first time I felt relaxed in all these hours of training. I felt the joy and freedom that we aviators have the privilege to experience.

I thought the best was over but wait – there's night XC. I had 100% anxiety and 0% expectations from the night XC, but little did I know it would be my favorite flight during PPL training. On my Navlog, I had a checkpoint called "Home". My CFI was in splits when she saw that, and we had this small challenge going on if I could spot my home. Guess what, my flight track was within 300 ft of my home, and I showed her my workplace too as a bonus (well that was much easier, the Chrysler building is probably the tallest in Auburn Hills). She didn't disappoint me either – she asked me to contact DTW approach and we flew the Detroit River tour around downtown and Ambassador bridge and then flew into DTW to land on RWY 27R. I was so proud of myself when I landed, but soon realized how small we were compared to all the other planes. Maybe I need to fly one of those, who knows!

All the aviation gods now had a different plan for me – just when I was ready for check-ride, my CFI got her call from the airlines and had to leave. I started with a new CFI and had to convince her that I was ready for the test. It was all a bit unsettling at the time, but later I realized that it made me a better pilot. My first CFI was very strict – she wanted me to be perfect which was great for a zero-hour student pilot. But now my new CFI was more relaxed, she taught in a practical manner and eased the cockpit environment which helped my confidence a lot.

Eventually, after a 3 month wait for my DPE – I got to hear the magic words, "Congratulations, you passed! Where do you want to fly next?". "Ummn, maybe I'll start with Mackinac, the Lake Erie Islands & North Fox. But also, the Hudson River SFRA. Sedona. Colorado, Alaska, and off course OSHKOSH".



# Ralph O. Helgeby EAA Chapter 77 Building Use Policy

Members are allowed to use the EAA Chapter 77 Facility in accordance with this policy ONLY.

Approval of use will be at the discretion of the EAA Chapter 77 Board of Director, on a first-come first-served basis, with EAA Chapter 77 activities ALWAYS taking precedence.

All use of the EAA Chapter 77 Facility must be an acceptable use per the current insurance carrier of EAA Chapter 77.

All uses of the EAA Chapter 77 Building Must Be Approved by the EAA Chapter 77 Board in advance of the Use. Application for Facility use will to call the current president, or vice president if the president is unavailable (out of town or unresponsive for more than 48 hours) for approval. Then put the requested event on the calendar in the EAA Chapter 77 meeting room.

Use of the EAA Chapter 77 Facility is restricted to the Meeting Room and Workroom ONLY; the hangar space cannot be used except by EAA Chapter 77 and those renting hangar space from EAA Chapter 77 without special Board approval.

EAA Chapter 77 use of ANY portion of the Facility shall supersede all other uses of the Facility.

All Use of the Facility will be placed on the Chapter Calendar.

Use of the Meeting Room will not exceed 75 occupants, 6.5 or 4.3 ft<sup>2</sup> per person.

Occupation of the Workroom will be approved by the Workroom Chairman in advance of occupation.

No Alcohol is allowed on EAA Chapter 77 property.

None of the Chapter Kitchen or Eating supplies shall be used; i.e. Plates, silverware, dish towels, etc. for anything other than Chapter activities.

No tape, pins or any adhesives are to be used on walls, doors, etc. when decorating or entertaining in any way. Magnets may be used on the Whiteboard. Tables, Chairs, etc. will be kept off the walls.

The used portion of the Facility shall be cleaned immediately after use, kitchen, towels, dishes, tools, floors and walls, etc.

A Donation is Expected for use of the Meeting Room and Workroom usage,
