

Did You Know...



William Bushnell Stout was born in Illinois in 1880, and after college was hired as the aviation editor for the Chicago Tribune. He later founded Aerial Age, one of America's earliest aviation magazines. In 1914, Stout-moved to Detroit to become chief engineer for the Scripps-Booth Automobile Company. In 1917, he was hired by Packard Motor Car Company's Aircraft Division to work on the Liberty engine program. Later that year, Stout was appointed technical advisor to the Aircraft Production Board in Washington, D.C. The board awarded Stout a contract to build a thick-winged monoplane featuring a blended wing-fuselage design. He returned to Detroit, obtained financial backing from Motor Products Corporation, and built this Stout Batwing in their shop. It was of wooden construction and was powered by a 150-horsepower Hispano-Suiza engine. The Batwing was delivered to McCook Field in Ohio in November 1918, and flown once by test pilot Lt. Jimmie Johnson. He commented that the airplane was too dangerous to fly because of the limited visibility from the cockpit, and the airplane was later scrapped.

ACCIDENT REPORT

An aircraft accident of any type is nothing to laugh about, but we couldn't help but chuckle at this one. This column hopefully will not see much exposure on these pages in future issues, but when it does, it is sincerely hoped that lessons learned through others' misfortunes will avert a replay of the events depicted here.

It was Oct. 18, 1985 - the wind was from the N.E. at 6 -10 M.P.H. The runway was SW to NE with mature Oak trees at the NE end. I was flying a 1983 Teratorn Tierra with 8 hours of training and 3 hours of solo to my credit.

After completing a successful take-off and circuit of the field, followed by an uneventful landing, a friend and flying companion suggested we should go aloft for some air-to-air photographs. Well suffice it to say, being a ham that would rival Ronald Coleman, I climbed back into my bird and prepared for departure, while totally ignoring a little voice that was trying to tell me not to go. To this day, I still don't understand why I didn't listen to my little voice. (Except that it could be noted that my younger brother was standing there watching).

I lined up on the runway and firewalled the throttle... Things were progressing nicely until I tried to horse her off the ground just a tad too early (A BIG TAD). With the stick in my gut, I was 3/4 the way down the runway to eating acorns at 20' AGL. I began to realize that all was not well. I shoved the stick forward for a humming bird heartbeat, and pulled it back to my gut again... *Great*... now I was flying a fully stalled airplane at 35 ft. AGL. I was wallowing down what was left of the runway, dancing on the rudder pedals as one wing or the other tried to fall off into a departure spin. I deduced from my vast aeronautical knowledge that my future was not bright. I had flown myself into one hell of a pickle. I was out of runway, time, airspeed and options - and a very LARGE oak tree was looming ever closer. I thought just maybe, if I could steer the plane just a bit to the left, I could clear the oak tree's little brother. Once over that I could dump the nose over the adjacent field and pick up some airspeed without harvesting any field corn in the process. If I could do *that*, I could regain control of my aircraft and my sphincter muscles and fly away. Alas, it was not to be... I thought I had made it when suddenly the right wing snagged a branch on the big oak tree, and spun my plane to the right, smack into the tree at 35 ft. AGL (or 35' O.A.K.). As I felt the plane turn violently to the right, I chopped the throttle, threw my arms across my head, ducked and prayed.

I heard branches breaking, acorns falling, squirrels scrambling for cover, Blue Jays and assorted winged creatures guffawing, Aluminum grinding on virgin oak, my engine idling complacently, and my heart pounding to a rhythm I had heard only on Dr. Welby, M.D... With my eyes still closed, I reached back and

hit the kill switch and heard peace and quiet except for a strange fluttering sound in my seat, and the sound of a few of the older and therefore slower squirrels still looking for a way out.

When I opened my eyes, I looked straight ahead and saw my brother perched in a branch with a look of utter disbelief on his face... He still can't explain how he managed to sprint 150 yards and climb up that tree before I'd even shut the engine off.

I remember that I simply walked off the plane onto a large branch and climbed down the trunk of the tree, whereupon I sat in the tall grass and reflected upon my good fortune and my not so good piloting skills. After a brief overnight stay, the airplane was recovered from the tree virtually unscathed.

I earned my wings that day... Wings with an Oak Leaf Cluster... And I hereby vow that from here on, I will always listen to my little voice.

Ralph O. Helgeby EAA Chapter 77 Building Use Policy

Members are allowed to use the EAA Chapter 77 Facility in accordance with this policy ONLY.

Approval of use will be at the discretion of the EAA Chapter 77 Board of Director, on a first-come first-served basis, with EAA Chapter 77 activities ALWAYS taking precedence.

All use of the EAA Chapter 77 Facility must be an acceptable use per the current insurance carrier of EAA Chapter 77.

All uses of the EAA Chapter 77 Building Must Be Approved by the EAA Chapter 77 Board in advance of the Use. Application for Facility use will to call the current president, or vice president if the president is unavailable (out of town or unresponsive for more than 48 hours) for approval. Then put the requested event on the calendar in the EAA Chapter 77 meeting room.

Use of the EAA Chapter 77 Facility is restricted to the Meeting Room and Workroom ONLY; the hangar space cannot be used except by EAA Chapter 77 and those renting hangar space from EAA Chapter 77 without special Board approval.

EAA Chapter 77 use of ANY portion of the Facility shall supersede all other uses of the Facility.

All Use of the Facility will be placed on the Chapter Calendar.

Use of the Meeting Room will not exceed 75 occupants, 6.5 or 4.3 ft² per person.

Occupation of the Workroom will be approved by the Workroom Chairman in advance of occupation.

No Alcohol is allowed on EAA Chapter 77 property.

None of the Chapter Kitchen or Eating supplies shall be used; i.e. Plates, silverware, dish towels, etc. for anything other than Chapter activities.

No tape, pins or any adhesives are to be used on walls, doors, etc. when decorating or entertaining in any way. Magnets may be used on the Whiteboard. Tables, Chairs, etc. will be kept off the walls.

The used portion of the Facility shall be cleaned immediately after use, kitchen, towels, dishes, tools, floors and walls, etc.

A Donation is Expected for use of the Meeting Room and Workroom usage,
