# ONCE IN A LIFETIME AIRPORTS IN THE PATH OF TOTALITY AND EVENTS PLANNED FOR THE ECLIPSE

A solar eclipse is a magnificent sight; the sky turns dark and the air temperature cools.

A total solar eclipse occurs when the moon temporarily blocks the entirety of the sun leaving only a bright outline visible. Usually, a total solar eclipse only occurs in the same location every 375 years. The first major eclipse of the sun in North America since 2017 will be visible on Monday, April 8, from Mexico, 14 U.S. states, and southeastern Canada. This is a much longer event than the August 21, 2017, event, with a wider path of totality. AOPA contacted the nearly 400 airports in the path of the April eclipse and found many have planned events, and many are offering camping, discounts on avgas, and deals on those all-important eclipse glasses. Check AOPA's airport directory event listings for activities on that date, or add ones if we missed them in our search. The eclipse passes through central Mexico in the morning, crossing over the Texas border at around 12:30 CDT.

Newsletter Editor Comment: AOPA page notes, "Many airports along the path of totality are planning events; there may be events at other airports, but we have only listed those in the path who responded to our inquiry" on their page.

The list and details are long, but include the following states: Texas, Arkansas, Illinois, Ohio, New York, Vermont, and Maine. ### Airports in the path of totality

AOPA ForeFlight content pack helps you plot your viewing site



Utilizing ForeFlight, AOPA has created a content pack that lets you plot the path of totality and view airports along the path. The eclipse path lines and totality times come from official data provided by NASA. The shaded areas indicate the amount of totality time and are as follows:

- Center shaded area (green when viewed on a sectional chart): four-plus minutes of totality.
- Outer shaded area (yellow when viewed on a sectional chart): three to four minutes of totality.

To download and install the 2024 Eclipse Content Pack for ForeFlight, use the device where you have ForeFlight installed and navigate to this URL: **aopa.org/eclipse2024**.

#### Did You Know...

## The first woman to design an airplane



The name E. Lilian Todd isn't one with which most of us are familiar, but we should be. Miss Todd is recognized as the first woman to design and build an airplane, though she herself never flew it.

A self-taught inventor with a love of mechanics, Todd co-patented a typewriter copy-holder in 1896, before becoming interested in aeuronautics in the early 1900s. After seeing airships in London and sketches of airplanes in a Parisian magazine, Todd exhibited her first design at Madison Square Garden in 1906, gaining national attention.

With the patronage of philanthropist Olivia Sage, Todd was able to begin work on her plane in 1908. Determined to fly it herself, she applied for permission in 1909, but was denied. And so on November 7, 1910 Miss Todd's plane, piloted by Didier Massson, flew for 20 feet over the Garden City aviation field near Mineola, Long Island, New York.

For a truly wonderful re-imagining of Miss Todd's plane's first flight, <u>this</u> short film by Kristina Yee is definitely worth watching!





## Ralph O. Helgeby EAA Chapter 77 Building Use Policy

Members are allowed to use the EAA Chapter 77 Facility in accordance with this policy ONLY.

Approval of use will be at the discretion of the EAA Chapter 77 Board of Director, on a first-come first-served basis, with EAA Chapter 77 activities ALWAYS taking precedence.

All use of the EAA Chapter 77 Facility must be an acceptable use per the current insurance carrier of EAA Chapter 77.

All uses of the EAA Chapter 77 Building Must Be Approved by the EAA Chapter 77 Board in advance of the Use. Application for Facility use will to call the current president, or vice president if the president is unavailable (out of town or unresponsive for more than 48 hours) for approval. Then put the requested event on the calendar in the EAA Chapter 77 meeting room.

Use of the EAA Chapter 77 Facility is restricted to the Meeting Room and Workroom ONLY; the hangar space cannot be used except by EAA Chapter 77 and those renting hangar space from EAA Chapter 77 without special Board approval.

EAA Chapter 77 use of ANY portion of the Facility shall supersede all other uses of the Facility.

All Use of the Facility will be placed on the Chapter Calendar.

Use of the Meeting Room will not exceed 75 occupants, 6.5 or 4.3 ft<sup>2</sup> per person.

Occupation of the Workroom will be approved by the Workroom Chairman in advance of occupation.

No Alcohol is allowed on EAA Chapter 77 property.

None of the Chapter Kitchen or Eating supplies shall be used; i.e. Plates, silverware, dish towels, etc. for anything other than Chapter activities.

No tape, pins or any adhesives are to be used on walls, doors, etc. when decorating or entertaining in any way. Magnets may be used on the Whiteboard. Tables, Chairs, etc. will be kept off the walls.

The used portion of the Facility shall be cleaned immediately after use, kitchen, towels, dishes, tools, floors and walls, etc.

A Donation is Expected for use of the Meeting Room and Workroom usage,

Any damage to EAA Chapter 77 property during the use will be billed to the using member.

No chemicals are to be poured down any drain or toilet in EAA77 facility. This includes paint and paint cleaning products, petroleum, grease, etc., regardless of chemical makeup of the product.
