Our hanger fund received a significant boost with a very generous donation from Gary Caravellla. Thank you very much Gary!

Our Spring Safety Meeting, arranged by Jim Adams, our FAASTeam Manager was a big success with nearly 70 people attending. The Bradley controllers, Ayaz Kagzi, Air Traffic Manager and Brian Mitchel, Air Space and Procedure Specialist, gave us a clear insight into how ATC controls and coordinates air traffic not just around Bradley but also New York and other areas. Of particular relevance to those flying out of Skylark is ATC wants us to over fly Bradley, with permission of course, rather than fly around the class C airspace. The reason for this is planes on the ILS to 6, 24, and 33 are at 1800 feet at the same places we are flying around at 2000 feet or so.

Many thanks to our volunteers who make these events possible by cooking, set up, clean up, make coffee, erect signs and many other details needed to make a successful event. Speaking of events, on June 7<sup>th</sup> we host the Quiet Bird Men for their monthly meeting. This is a significant fundraiser for our chapter. The following evening is our monthly meeting. On June 11 we have our Young Eagles Flight day with 166 and KHFD. As a reminder, you must have completed the youth protection program to fly Young Eagles. Thanks to those of you who completed the program. June is a busy month for the chapter!
