## EAA2 Young Eagles

Reminder to all Young Eagle pilots and ground volunteers:

Thank you so much for those of you who have completed the youth protection training and background check. For those who have completed it, but have not yet sent me the certificate email, please do so. **EAA has set a deadline of May 1 to have this completed**. That's only two months away.

As of today (February 28, 2016) we have 8 pilots and 8 ground support who have emailed their Youth Protection Policy Certificate to me. Even though we have 8 ground support, we strongly encourage all ground support who regularly help at our rallies to complete this training. Having many ground support with the training will ensure that we will always comply with the two-deep leadership requirement. Another reason for having numerous trained volunteers is that we will have plenty of volunteers who are aware of the policy and know what is expected by EAA.

EAA members received an email from Jack Pelton EAA CEO/Chairman on Saturday, February 27, 2016. We urge you to read the entire email, but here is some updated information about Young Eagles:

"Within the Young Eagles segment, you'll note the following changes, thanks to the input of members and volunteers:

- Removing what many thought was an overly burdensome photography policy. There are now simple guidelines to work with parents when taking photos.
- No requirement to provide a Social Security Number when completing the background check (it is optional).
- Simplified requirements for ground volunteers at Young Eagles rallies, to requiring only twodeep leadership that has completed the training and background checks.
- Elimination of the staff-to-youth ratio for Young Eagles rallies.
- Clarification on topics such as supervision in an aircraft, individual Young Eagles flights, and record keeping."

There are links in his email that have important information that should be reviewed.

### Save the Date





## Homebuilt Corner - Vacuum Bending Method Developed by Honorary Chapter 2 Member Morry Hummel

Many Chapter 2 members had the pleasure of knowing Morry Hummel. I am fortunate to have had a great friendship with Morry. He was a brilliant aircraft designer and pioneer, developing the ½ VW engine, and the many variants of Hummel designs – both Experimental and Ultralight.

His all metal designs are known for their efficient design and frugal construction. Many of these designs achieve 3 MPH per engine HP! Today, Terry Hallett continues to supply Hummel Aircraft designs and continue the Morry Hummel legacy.

Morry Hummel and Terry Hallett have had a great solution for one of the toughest challenges in building an aircraft – putting a bend in long aluminum wing and tail skins. By using a vacuum cleaner and a sheet of visqueen poly plastic; air pressure can be harnessed to make these bends easily! Check out the following pictures of how this is done.



PVC or metal pipe sets the final bend radius




Pipe has several vacuum holes along length



Poly plastic seals to table, air being sucked out



Aluminum skin formed around pipe



Finished wing skin with bend



Skin installed on ribs and spar using straps

Using a vacuum to harness simple air pressure (14.7 psi) really adds up when you have a lot of area!
