What's the Job of a Firewall?

- Keep Out
- Heat and Flame
- Noxious Gases
- Liquids

Firewall Materials

- -- Acceptable without Testing --
- Stainless steel sheet, .015 inch thick
- Galvanized sheet steel, .018 inch thick
- Titanium sheet, .016 inch thick
- Monel metal sheet, .018 inch thick

Surface Treatment

- Over Aluminum, Wood, Fiberglass
- · Less Weight
- Ablative
- Insulate
- Intumescent



In conjunction with the upcoming Fourth of July, Mike gave his own fiery demonstration of various fire resistant materials. His own Tango uses a firewall of aluminum with a sandwiched fire resistant material..
