David Gerdeman flew his C-172 and Kristi and I flew our 182 to the Cheat River Fly-In. The fly-in is located on an island in the Cheat River just South of Rowlesburg, WV.

This was the first time attending for both of us. I watched a few videos of the arrival to prepare myself for the approach. The approach has you overfly the airport and enter downwind South of the airport. At this point you unable to see the airport due to being in the valley. Approximately 2 miles past the airport there was a low point in the mountains where I decided to make the base turn. We dropped below the mountain tops and descended into the valley on our final approach. After flying the river valley, we spotted the island airport with its 1850 ft runway.

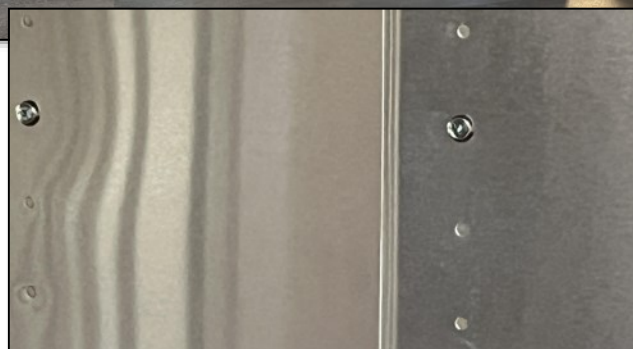

CLE Tower is now allowed to give tours. Brian Safran let us know he can take up to 7 people at a time, his number is 330-635-1523.

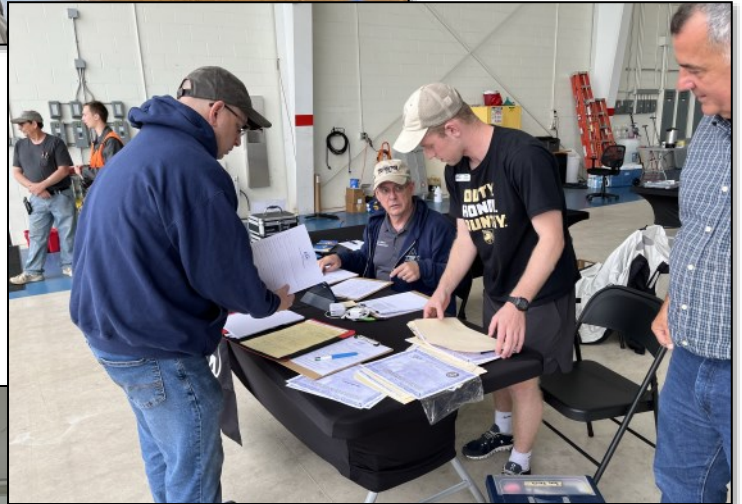

Cool Project!

I've been wanting to make an electronic METAR map for a few years now and I finally found the time to get it done. These can be purchased online and can also be quite expensive. There are several companies that currently make them and they come in all different forms, the map I made can be purchased for \$975 online, yikes!

In true homebuilder fashion, I found a kit online to purchase that had the electronics and LED lights already set up for you to use. For my project I used a chart from the state of Ohio as the base map which



was then glued to a sheet of melamine board using spray adhesive. Next was to drill holes for the LED lights at each location that I wanted to have a weather report for.

The kit came with a string of 50 LED lights which was enough to cover most of the Ohio weather reporting



AWOS/ASOS sites. Next task was to begin gluing them into the holes in a logical pattern to eventually program into the supplied Pi mini computer. Unfortunately there was only 2.5 inches of spacing between each LED light so I ended up having to splice over 100 individual wires together to be able to stretch the string of LED lights out

far enough to reach each location. That was several nights worth of work soldering wires together and burning my fingertips to get everything working.

With all the wires soldered together and the LED lights glued into their spots using a hot glue gun, it was a simple matter to connect to my home Wi-Fi signal and program the mini Pi computer to accept the airport identifiers for each weather reporting station.

The kit manufacturer had already done the hard part of the programming and although I used a laptop, you can actually complete the programming from just a smartphone, pretty slick!

The last task was to create a wood frame that would allow the whole map to float off of the wall to allow space for the LED lights and electronics behind the map.

The final result turned out great and the computer allows you to not only use the standard green for VFR, blue for marginal VFR, red for IFR and pink for low IFR, but to also add different colors for lightning, high wind and even icing conditions. It can even be programmed to turn off and on automatically and once set up, automatically updates its software as needed!



All in all I spent about \$150 between the kit I purchased online and the materials I purchased to finish everything which included extra wiring and the wood to make the backing and frame.

“CHAMP268”

This awesome Champ 7AC is owned by Chapter member **Steve Zvada** and is hangered at 3G3. “CHAMP268”, SN2958 was certified June 11, 1946, and has plenty of upgrades during its existence. ‘268’ now sports a Cont. O-200A and metal prop, battery for a B&C starter, a Maule TW, rebuilt wings with new wooden spars and lift struts in 2014. During this past winter Roy Maneely did a wonderful job rebuilding the landing gear and brakes and completed the annual inspection.

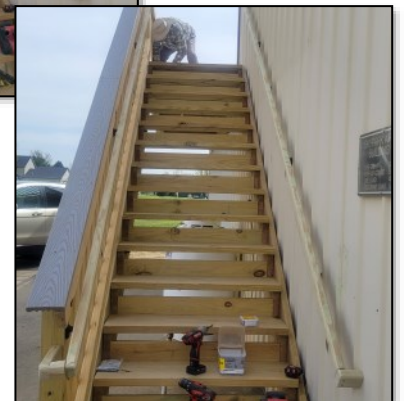

Rans S-21 Build Update

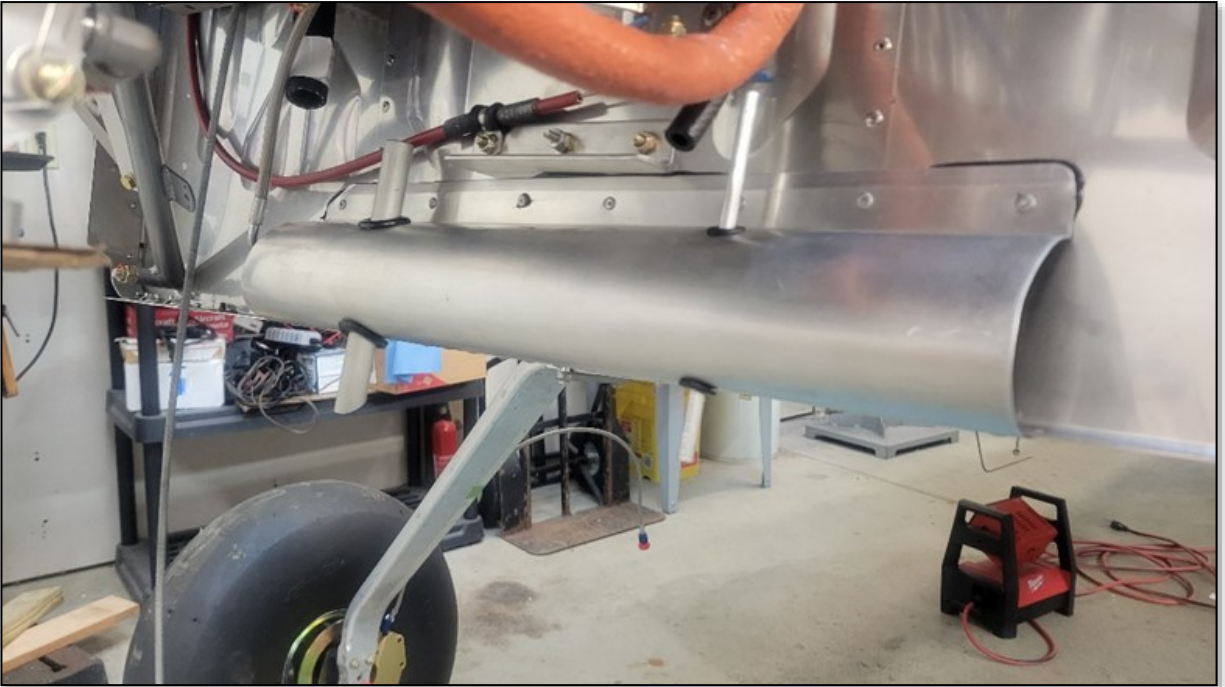

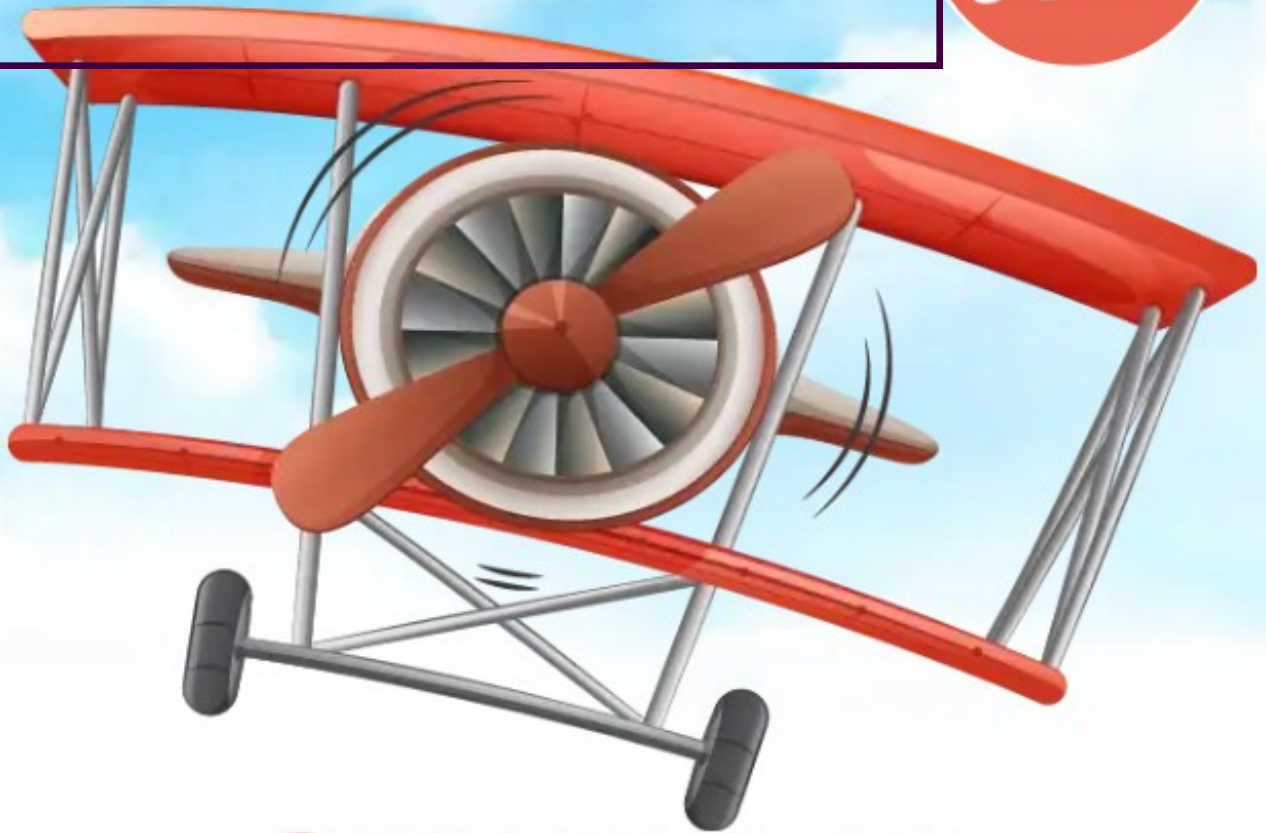
