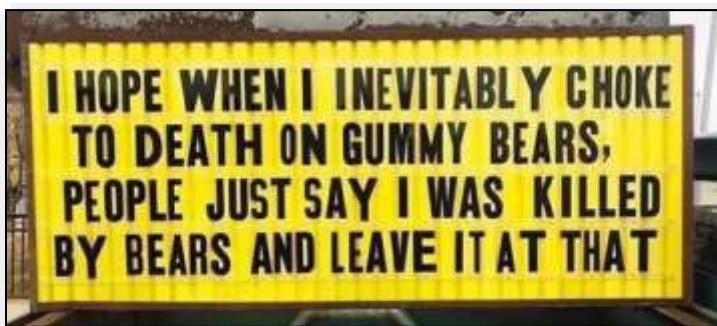

Louisville WWII veteran John Lawton soon to turn 100

NOTE- John Lawton would write "Technical Corners" articles for the Wingnut for many years. He joined the Chapter in 1994 and moved to Boulder, CO, sometime around 2016.

Louisville resident John Lawton created the first avalanche rescue transceiver, escaped Vienna after Kristallnacht, fought with the U.S. Army during World War II and will turn 100 June 3.

U.S. Rep. Joe Neguse, D-Colo., visited Lawton on Tuesday to honor him with a flag that was flown over the Capitol and thank him for his service. Neguse said he would love

to have Lawton share his story with local high school students as a way to hear real stories of WWII.

“He’s living history,” Neguse said.

Lawton joked and said that is out of his control; he will simply turn 100 years old.

“I don’t intend to make a big ‘to-do’ about it, but I think it’s gonna be the biggest birthday bash I’ve had in a while,” Lawton said.

His son, Mark Lawton, said his father is the eldest son of a Jewish shopkeeper. John Lawton and his father had to hide in that shop during Kristallnacht in Austria, Mark Lawton said. John Lawton said his parents never told him the full details, just that they managed to flee to England before the war started.

“There was a guy named Adolf Hitler, and he didn’t like the Jews. So we figured it was time to leave,” John Lawton joked.

John Lawton was in the United States for the bombing of Pearl Harbor on Dec. 7, 1941. He said shortly after that he tried to enlist for the U.S. Army, but he was turned away because he was not an American citizen. However, three months later he was drafted. John Lawton said at that point he was made a citizen so he could join the war effort.

John Lawton served in a reconnaissance team in the 91st Infantry Division, and spent most of the war in Northern Africa and in Italy.

Instead of trying to recall specific moments from the war, he said would share his “close calls.” In written documents he shared, he revealed that on his first reconnaissance mission, his group became disoriented while walking through the woods. His group saw other soldiers, so they were going to ask them for help locating themselves. His group gave up on speaking with them after they received fire. It was only a few moments later that John Lawton and his group became aware they were about to ask German soldiers for help. It was also during this mission that John Lawton learned the difference between American and German footprints.

“I could look for two seconds and tell you if it was a German shoe or an American shoe. Not that the feet are different, but the boots are different,” John Lawton said.

He said he found it interesting that he could tell the difference so clearly by the shoeprints, but no one but him seemed to care.

Beth Lawton, John Lawton’s wife, said he got a doctoral degree in electrical engineering from Cornell University despite never graduating from high school. He said he lasted one week in high school in New York because he already knew everything they were teaching.

John Lawton said his proudest creation is a transceiver called Skadi. He used it on a ski patrol team in Buffalo, New York, when he would regularly have to look for lost people on mountains. His ski patrol team would use a long pole with teeth on the end to poke down to look for people. However, he came up with a better idea. He invented the first avalanche transceiver, which made it easier to find people in the snow. He said it worked quite simply.

“As you get closer with the receiver to the transmitter, the signal gets louder, and that’s how you find it,” John Lawton said.

John Lawton said Skadi has saved thousands of lives. By simply going where the transceiver gets louder, many people could be found. He laughed and shared that he knows someone who was rescued with the help of a Skadi transceiver three separate times.

Joyce Parella, John Lawton’s daughter, said that her dad has always just been her dad.

“He’s pretty tough,” Parella said

She said it feels incredible that he will be turning 100 years old soon, as he recently underwent two femur surgeries. She added that the best thing about being his daughter is how smart he is.

I will continue my training at Skypark with my CFI, Tom DeLong, flying 3-4 times per week.

In addition, I will soon begin studying for my written test, and I already have it scheduled for the first week of June. Previous Ray Scholar Abby Donofrio and current Ray Scholars Logan Cohara and Case McIntyre have graciously offered mentorship and support. It is with complete certainty our friendships will prosper and the journey to a PPL will be collaborative and fulfilling on all ends.

Finally, I would like to thank everyone again for the immense support and hospitality shown thus far in the chapter. Chapter 846 is truly a second family and a privilege to be around some of the most passionate, ethical, and leadership-oriented people in aviation. I extend my appreciation to Mike Guenther for making this process easy and accessible. Mike has served as a leader in helping our chapter's youth and scholarships thrive.

Hopefully, you will see some touch-and-go work from the hangar deck in the coming weeks. I can't wait for the journey ahead, and I'm excited to make this summer full of aviation, both in and out of the aircraft.

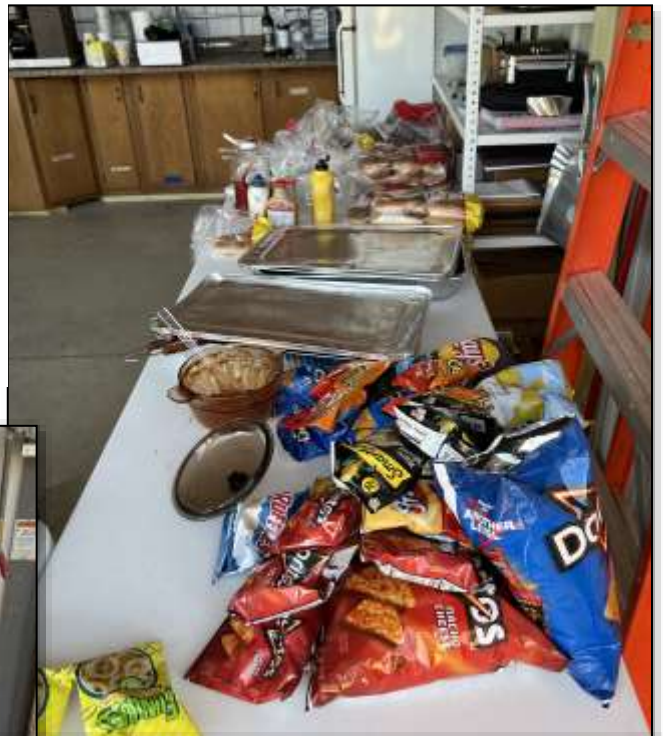

Highlander Project!

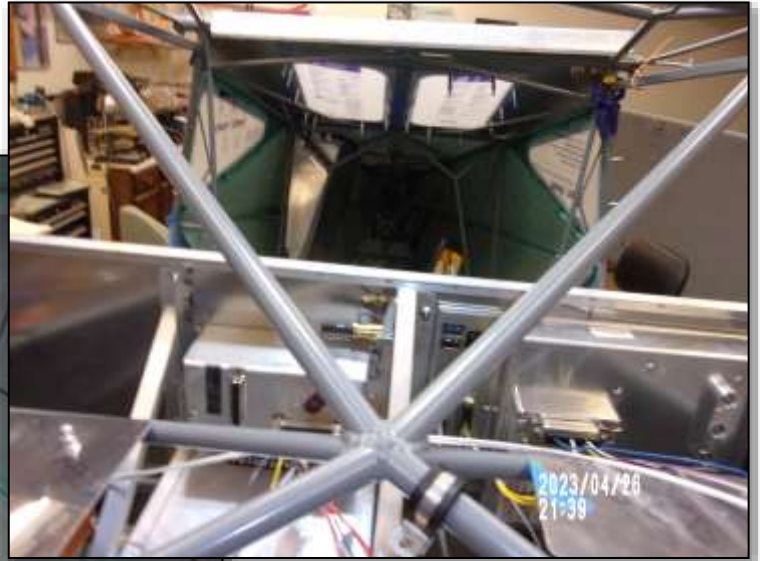

Josh and I have been making progress on the Highlander. We have been working on terminating and securing wires in the wings and fuselage. We have the fuselage side windows and turtle deck windows cut out and pilot holes all drilled. We are doing the fabrication on many of the detail parts, such as the wing fuel tank covers, cowling etc.

Next big step will be to hang the wings. The wings have to be on to fit and install the butt ribs, fit the Lexan over the cockpit, run flight control cables for the ailerons and flaps, route the pitot lines, route fuel lines from the wing fuel tanks and finalize our wiring.



We are hoping to start painting before too long.

Minutes of April 13, 2023

Vice President Brad Wurst called the gathering to order at 19:14 and welcomed all in attendance.

Young Eagles Build and Fly Program: Greg Cantrell

Chapter Secretary Greg Cantrell discussed and gave an overview of the program which is a build and fly initiative coordinated with EAA Chapters and local AMA R/C Clubs. It is meant to introduce kids to aircraft construction and the fundamentals of flight. Greg will give an update at the May gathering and is hopeful our EAA chapter can partner with the Wayne County R/C Club to participate in this program.

Flight Training Scholarship Donation: Mike Guentner

Mike Guentner, Ray Scholarship Coordinator, gave an excellent presentation detailing a recent donation to the Chapter specifically for flight training. He explained this was not part of the Ray Scholarship Program, but would be a separate scholarship by our Chapter. The plan is to accept the donation and later in the summer apply for a second Ray Scholarship if funds are available from EAA. If this option is not available, he proposed our Chapter use the \$2000 still available from the Charlie Cartledge donation along with \$4000 of Chapter funds for a total scholarship of \$11,000. This would be the equal to the Ray Scholarship Awarded to the Chapter for 2023. Mike reviewed with Chapter members how highly qualified our two candidates this year were and how close the vote count was. Based on these criteria, Mike recommended the donated scholarship be awarded to the 2023 Ray Scholarship runner up, Jack Pomfret. A motion was made by Greg Cantrell and seconded by Dave Gerdeman to accept the donation for the scholarship, proceed with Mike's recommendation for funding the remaining \$6000 of the scholarship, and award the scholarship to Chapter member and 2023 Ray Scholarship runner up, Jack Pomfret. The motion passed unanimously by a voice vote.

Ray Scholarship Update: Mike Guentner

Mike presented 2023 Ray Scholarship recipient, Case McIntyre, with his large check. Congratulations, Case. Mike reported 2022 Ray Scholarship recipient, Logan Cohara, is working toward completing his final cross country and then his check ride to complete his training.
