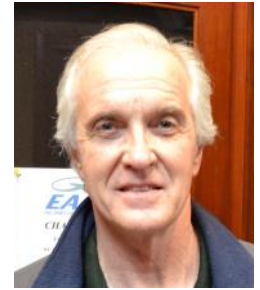

Bill writes:

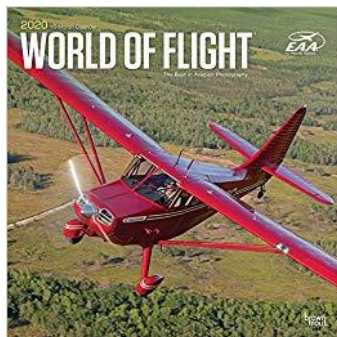

J3 Cub Restoration Update: The Cub has wings!

On Friday, Nov 1 we had a wing hanging party. After almost 6 years and 2500hrs of work, it was time to mount the wings on my Cub for, hopefully, the final time. What makes a wing hanging party successful? Lots of friends, some expertise (still looking for that one) and beer (AFTER the wings are on). I tried to have everything ready so when the hired help arrived, we could get right to it. We initially used bolts that were one size under. That speeded things up getting the wings in place initially. Then we went back and replaced the bolts one by one with the correct sizes. Since then, we've leveled the airplane and rigged the wings to the proper settings for dihedral and washout, as well as the tail surfaces. Many thanks to Gary Baker, Karl Aber, Gary Kohler, Ron Lutz, Paul Lutz, Christi Lutz, Mimi Lutz and Bridgette Lutz (our expert flashlight holder) for the great help and encouragement. (My apologies to Bridgette—she thought she was coming to a wing party, as in Buffalo Wings. I promise Bridgette, next time we'll have real Buffalo wings, not Cub wings). This is what the EAA is all about—fellow members helping out whenever asked—adding that special touch to every project we do. Thanks again to everyone- rides will be given when it warms up!
