Fly-In Etiquette

Fly-In season is upon us and many will be attending pancake breakfasts and fly-ins around the state on weekends. The texting app Telegram will be busy with messages about upcoming fly-outs. We have all seen poor etiquette exhibited at past fly-ins and hopefully, we won't be the ones that others talk about.

Here are some suggestions for all of us to keep in mind:

- Check for any NOTAMS applicable to the event.
- Ensure your flight app, ForeFlight, Garmin Pilot, etc. is up to date with the current downloads.
- Share an open seat with other Chapter members.
- Be aware of your aircraft's capabilities.
- Bring tiedowns, just in case.
- Be aware of possible blind spots at the airport.
- Pay attention to the radio calls of other aircraft.
- Follow marshallers' directions when taxiing.
- Don't feel pressured to taxi into tight areas.
- Shut down the engine if there are folks walking close to your aircraft.
- If you are nervous about people walking around your aircraft and touching it, bring some caution tape or stakes to keep folks away. Don't leave the aircraft for lengthy periods; stay in the area or park farther away

from other aircraft.

- Take a prop card that states "Do not touch"
- Consider asking for a marshaller when leaving to keep folks away.
- Don't taxi directly from your parking spot-pull the aircraft out and position it in an area where propwash will not blow into other aircraft.
- Clear the area around you before completing your runup.
- Consider delaying your departure from the event so that you are not caught in a mass exodus.
- Use your checklists to ensure nothing is missed, such as takeoff flap setting or taking off on one magneto because of an interruption.
- There is no need to show off your flying skills during the arrival or departure by performing airshow maneuvers, such as steep pull-ups or high-speed flybys in a busy environment.

Remember, the main reason you are attending this event is to have fun. Don't force yourself into the pattern or ignore the event's volunteers' signals to you.

Happy Aviation Maintenance Technician Day!

"It was a hot June night in Dayton. It must have been a Saturday because I was at the Wright Cycle Company gassing [chatting] with Wilbur and Orville. They stayed open Saturday nights to take care of the folks who worked all week... One of the brothers, I forget which, asked me how would I like to go to work for them. There were just the two of them in the shop, and they said they needed another hand. They offered me \$18 a week," said Charles E. Taylor. He was the quiet and little-known inventor of the Wright Flyer airplane engine who often called the famous Orville and Wilbur Wright the "Wright Boys.

Charles E. Taylor, a humble man from the Midwest, lived in the nineteenth and twentieth centuries. He was born on May 24, 1868, in Cerro Gordo, Illinois, to Willett and Elmira Taylor. He had four siblings named Gilbert, John, Raura, and Albert. His early life involved going to school at Scott Street High School and the Granger College of Engineering. At age 12, Charles started working for the *Nebraska State Journal*. He worked as an errand boy, a binder and eventually a tool maker.

In 1896, Charles, with his wife and child, moved to Dayton, Ohio, for a better job and to be near his wife's family. He first worked for the Stoddard Manufacturing Company which made farm equipment and bicycles, prior to opening his own tool shop. Charles met the Wright brothers through his wife's family and in 1901, he started to work for them full-time.

As an employee of the Wright brothers, Charles ran the bicycle shop while Orville and Wilbur conducted glider tests in North Carolina. Charles also aided the Wright brothers' aeronautical tests by helping them to build a wind tunnel.

After the Wright brothers' 1902 glider tests, they wanted to try powered flight. Unable to find someone to make the engine, they turned to Charles for help. Only using a drill press, lathe, and other hand tools, Charles built a 13 hp engine in only six weeks. Charles also made all the

metal parts that were used on the airframe of the Wright Flyer.

In 1928, Charles moved to California, but during the Great Depression, Charles lost his job at a machine shop. In 1937, as Henry Ford was developing Greenfield Village,

detectives were

used to locate Charles Taylor in Los Angeles. After helping to recreate the bicycle shop, Charles continued to "work" in the shop for Henry Ford until 1941.

Charles moved back to California in 1941 and worked until suffering a heart attack in 1945. Unable to pay for his bills, Charles lived in a charity ward of a Los Angeles hospital, until 1955 when a reporter discovered him there. After funds were raised, Charles lived his last few months in a private sanitarium. He died on January 30, 1956, and is buried at the Portal of Folded Wings Mausoleum at Valhalla Memorial Park in Los Angeles, among other aviation pioneers.

Charles Taylor is remembered through the Charles Taylor Master Mechanic Award, which recognizes lifetime achievements of aircraft mechanics. His image can also be seen on the FAA mechanic's license.

Coming up on May 24, is Aviation Maintenance Technician Day, which is celebrated on Charles Taylor's birthday.

EAA Learn to Fly Week Returns May 13-17, 2025



There is no doubt, whether it was at the barbershop or doctor's office, when you've talked about your love for aviation, you've been met with this response: "I have always wanted to learn to fly, but...." Or "I started my ground school years ago and took a few lessons, but..."

It is a story as old as time: Aspiring aviators have the desire, but there are extenuating circumstances that are preventing them from pursuing their dream of flight. Here at EAA, we know there is an opportunity to turn these dreamers into doers.

EAA's mission is to "grow participation in aviation by sharing The Spirit of Aviation." This mission is fully embraced by EAA's 300,000-plus members and 900 local chapters. Though we can't break down every barrier, it is hard to find an organization and group of members more well-equipped to help aspiring aviators find their place in the sky.

Through EAA's vast library of educational materials and local chapter advocates, the organization is perfectly placed to help grow the pilot population.

To further the efforts of growing the aviation community, EAA Learn to Fly Week, supported by Sporty's Pilot Shop, is returning on May 13-17, 2025!

The week will consist of three straight days of educational and interactive webinars. Topics will range from how to get started in flight training to tips for passing the FAA written exam, how to save time and money in flight training, strategies for the checkride, pinch-hitter presentations, and so much more!

Representatives from EAA, Sporty's Pilot Shop, Redbird, TakeFlight Interactive, and designated pilot examiners from across the country will be presenting this wide range of webinars. Following each presentation, attendees will have time for Q&A with the presenters.

The final day of Learn to Fly Week, May 17, 2025, will play host to chapter Flying Start events across the country. Flying Start events are open house-style activities that introduce local aspiring pilots to the local knowledge, tools, and connections that they need to accomplish their goal of becoming a pilot.

During the Flying Start event, chapter members will break down the perceived barriers common to the nonaviation community that prevent people from pursuing their pilot certificate.

Following a short presentation from the chapter and local flight instructors about learning to fly, Flying Start attendees are paired with an Eagle Flight mentor pilot for a free introductory flight. At the conclusion of the flight, the attendee will be provided with a free six-month trial EAA membership!

Flying Start participants will walk away from the event with an "I can do this" point of view, and a clear understanding of "how flying can fit into my life," and "what I can do with this hobby."
