
Ray Scholar Update:



Luray Caverns

If you're looking for a good cross country trip and want to fly to the eastern end and Shenandoah Valley region of Virginia, I'd recommend a stop at Luray Caverns in Lu-

ray, Virginia.




If you think "if I've seen one stalactite-I've seen them all"--you'd be wrong. The mile+ long trail takes you deep into the cavern revealing many different mineral types of formations and a noteworthy vista created from a mirror lake that makes the water seem deep with formations when in reality it is the


ceiling above. Around every corner there is something different to see.

There is even an organ that uses the stalactites for creating the notes. Included in the admission price to the caverns is a toy museum, a carriage and

car museum (with many Cleveland made cars), and a history museum/village of life in Shenandoah Valley circa 1850-1865.



The Next Project...

Our 1946 Taylorcraft is working well, so as to not be bored, we are onto our next projects. We have been prepping Hangar D2 for our accordion style doors and we got the elevator and rudder removed from our 1947 Stinson 108-1. Some of you might have heard, I discovered breaks in the lower longerons by the landing gear. The suspicion is they were caused by numerous hard landings from teaching new private pilots. So, the tail is being removed, the wings removed, engine removed, fuselage fabric stripped, landing gear removed, entire fuselage inspected, repair the breaks, prime the areas that were repaired, recover, and reassemble.

If you ever thought that working on a certified aircraft was easier, trust me, it's no worse than a scratch-built experimental- **Chris Shearer**

Slow progress but progress nonetheless. I've recently been prepping and priming all of the aft wing ribs for both the left and right wings. Having all my workbenches and a wing stand that is mobile has been a huge help. I have a few more ribs to prep before I can rivet them to the main spars.


