TECHNICAL COUNSELOR ADVICE:

Chuck Warren

Many of the Chapter's aircraft owners are trying to do more in the way of preventive maintenance and providing assistance to their mechanic. This is good practice and helps in their own understanding of the plane's systems and creating an awareness of any areas that need more care or to be watched more closely to maintain airworthiness.

The annual inspection is a formal airworthiness checkup, performed according to a checklist that is usually developed by a manufacturer and tailored to a specific model. The listing of items performed during that inspection alo encompasses many items that a pilot may do as preventive maintenance. Some airplanes, such as antiques or some homebuilts, do not have checklists. In these cases a more generic one is often used. There are numerous generic lists on the internet and the FAA publishes one of them in Part 43 of the regulations.

For the owner just getting acquainted with doing more of the hands on work, an inspection list that includes criteria for what conditions and discrepancies to look out for, and what "airworthy" looks like when discrepancies are fixed can be quite handy if the owner is assisting their mechanic performing the annual.

Also, it can be helpful guidance for the owner to check their own preventive maintenance work for completeness.

One free downloadable inspection checklist that has a fair amount of guidance and criteria is found on the Piper Owners' Society website. However, at 14 pages, it is a bit lengthy to put in this newsletter. A link is provided below:
