# EAA Chapter 863- Lebanon, TN 2025 Flight Scholarship Announcement

EAA #863 is proud to announce that the Ray Foundation is sponsoring a full \$12,000 flight scholarship for our chapter again this year. Following are the requirements to apply for this exciting opportunity with our chapter:

- 1) Student must be between the ages of 16 and 18.
- 2) Student must have at least a 3.0 GPA
- 3) Student must have completed an application for or posses an FAA Student Pilot Certificate
- 4) Student must be able to pass an FAA 3<sup>rd</sup> class medical exam
- 5) Student must be a member of the National EAA Organization and the EAA #863 youth group
- 6) Student must reside in the Middle TN area.
- 7) Student must be an active participant in EAA Chapter 863 and Chapter youth group activities
- 8) Student must submit a personally written 1500 word essay describing how you became interested in aviation, how your first flight affected your interest in aviation, and how you plan to support the chapter through your 2 hour per month volunteer commitment.

The deadline for applications is midnight on Sunday, 06 APR 2025. The application packet must be complete in order to be considered. *Applications received after the deadline will not be considered*.

A selection board is scheduled for Tuesday 08 APR 2025 at the EAA Hangar. Applicants will be notified via the email address provided in the application packet of their assigned interview time on Monday 07 APR, 2025. You must appear for an interview in order to be considered for this scholarship.

Completed application packets are to be submitted to <u>eaascholarship@wreyford.net</u>

Application Packet must include:

- 1) Application Form
- 2) Copy of FAA Student Pilot Certificate or submitted application for Certificate
- Copy of FAA 3<sup>rd</sup> Class Medical or confirmation of a doctor's appointment prior to 30 APR 2025 with an FAA Designated Medical Examiner for the exam
- 4) Above referenced Essay.
- 5) Signed Student / Parental commitment form
- 6) Copy of most recent report card or letter from school with your current GPA.
- 7) Letter of Recommendation-other than a Parent

### EAA Chapter #863 2025 Ray Aviation Flight Scholarship Application Frequently Asked Questions

#### Q: What if I don't have my 3<sup>rd</sup> Class Medical Certificate yet?

- A: You must be able to pass a 3<sup>rd</sup> Class Medical in order to receive the scholarship. If you do not currently have a 3<sup>rd</sup> Class Medical Certificate, you mush show proof that you have an appointment scheduled with an FAA designated Medical Examiner before 30 APR 2025 in order to apply for the scholarship. <u>Note that you must PASS the medical exam BEFORE you can be awarded this scholarship</u>. If you are selected to receive this scholarship and have not received your Medical by 31 MAY 2025, you will forfeit the scholarship and it will be awarded to someone else.
- Q: How do I obtain my Student Pilot Certificate?
- A: To apply for your Student Pilot Certificate, you may apply through the online FAA portal, fill out a paper application, or the *recommended method*, contact a certified flight instructor (CFI) and work them to get the application submitted.

Trish Yates, one of our members who is a CFI, has volunteered to help applicants get their paperwork completed for the student pilot certificate. She can be contacted via phone at 615.813.9785 or by email at <u>tyates\_home@yahoo.com</u>. According to the FAA Web site, it takes approximately three weeks to get your certificate if you use the online system. <u>You MUST have this certificate before you can be awarded this scholarship</u>. If you are selected to receive this scholarship and have not received your Student Pilot Certificate by <u>31 MAY 202</u>5, you will forfeit the scholarship and it will be awarded to someone else.

- Q: Will having prior flight instruction detrimentally affect my consideration for this scholarship?
- A: No!! It does, however, let the review board know how dedicated you are to achieving your license.
- Q: How do I access the Sporty's Online Learn to Fly Course?
- A: When a young eagle takes their first discovery flight, they receive a logbook from EAA. Using the Code on that logbook, you create your student account on the EAA website. Once you create that Student Account, Sporty's will contact you with your ID and password to the Learn to Fly Course.
- Q: How often do I need to fly?
- A: As a recipient of this scholarship, you are making a commitment to fly at least twice a week, preferably three times a week unless weather, or aircraft availability prevent it. Students who fly less than twice a week spend an inordinate amount of time "re-learning" a portion of the last lesson. Each time there is a gap in training which results in unnecessary expense and wasted scholarship funds.

- Q: What if I exhaust the scholarship funds and I have not completed my training?
- A: Attached to this FAQ you will find an estimated expenses list showing all the expenses involved in achieving your Pilot's License. You will note that this list can vary plus or minus \$3,000 according to how well you progress in your training. That said, the estimated cost for a Private Pilot's rating is almost \$18,000, which is \$6,000 more than the value of the scholarship. As a recipient of this scholarship the student, with their parents support, are making a commitment to providing any funding required beyond the \$12,000, provided by the scholarship, to complete the attainment of a Private Pilot Rating.

- I commit to spending a minimum of <u>three hours per week</u> studying for my written exam using the Sporty's online "Learn to Fly" curriculum.
- 8) I commit to spending a minimum of <u>three hours per week</u> after I have passed my written exam studying the following books for my FAA check ride:
  - a. Pilots Handbook of Aeronautical Knowledge
  - b. Airplane Flying Handbook
  - c. Oral Test Prep Guide
  - d. Airmen Certification Standards
  - e. Gliem Knowledge Test Study Book
  - f. FAR/AIM
